
Snakes don't chew their food. They have teeth designed

NOT A FUN FACT


Yes, alligators have eaten a few people.

Alligators don't always eat the whole animal they catch. They often bury it and eat the rest later.


ENCIRCLE AND SQUEEZE, A DEADLY TECHNIQUE

Burmese pythons kill their prey by encircling them and squeezing them. They squeeze until the animal can't breathe.





The alligator has a long, thick tail. The tail is almost




DO SNAKES HAVE TAILS?

Not really. Its whole body is just shaped like a tail. Pythons are also excellent swimmers.




