The Northwest Library was originally funded through the 2000 City Bond Election, and plans are currently underway to begin the project. In addition, the Capitol Hill Library does not meet the criteria to make the building handicap accessible (ADA compilance). Funding for Belle Isle Library, Oklahoma City's busiest library, will also provide additional parking and space for more library materials.
