The Northwest Library was originally funded through the 2000 City Bond Election, and plans are currently underway to begin the project. Because of the escalating Oklahoma economy, construction costs and inflation have taken a rise. More and more Oklahoma City residents are moving to the northwest area, and additional money is needed to build a library that would be the appropriate size for that fast growing community.

Plans include:

- Meeting and study spaces
- Vibrant children's area
- Exciting teen/young adult section
- Books, books and more books

Two Metropolitan Library System libraries, Capitol Hill Library and Belle Isle Library are needing funds to update the buildings and bring them up to current building and life safety codes. Both buildings still have the original electrical and mechanical systems and are in critical need of replacement. In addition, the Capitol Hill Library does not meet the criteria to make the building handicap accessible (ADA compliance). Funding for Belle Isle Library, Oklahoma City's busiest library, will also provide additional parking and space for more library materials.
