"The Sarod is a popular stringed instrument of Hindustani music," explains Dana Morrow, Director of Outreach Services. "The body is carved from a single piece of well-seasoned teakwood and the belly covered with goat skin. Sarod has been found in carvings of the 1st century in Champa temple and also in paintings in the Ajanta caves."

Narayan has played the sarod since the age of six. "The instrument," he said, "is only a means, not an end. True music emanates from within the musician, and not within the instrument."

Narayan, who was awarded a gold medal by the President of India after placing first in a competition conducted by All-India Radio, is the eldest son of Pandit Ram Narayan, who is the world-renowned Sarangi maestro. The Sarangi is one of the oldest and most important bowed instruments of India.

The Tabla is the most popular percussion instrument used in North Indian Classical music. Percussion instruments of this construction can be seen in Indian temple sculptures dating back thousands of years, although it is generally agreed that the present form was

popularized in the 17th and 18th Centuries.

Abhijit Banerjee has performed all over India and has toured extensively in USA, Canada, U.K., Europe, Japan, Australia and many other countries. He is considered one of the top-ranking masters of his generation and has performed all over India as well as in the U.S., U.K., Europe, Japan and Australia.
