MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE METROPOLITAN LIBRARY COMMISSION OF OKLAHOMA COUNTY

Norick Downtown Library, 300 Park Avenue, Oklahoma City, on May 25, 2017, in conformity with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act §311.

I. Ms. Nancy Anthony called the meeting or order at 3:34 p.m. Roll was called to establish a quorum.

Present: Carlson, Coffey, Cory, Friedemann, Harpman, Nelson, Patterson, Rice, Shockley, Shonts, Smith Sosa, Toland, Anthony (Arrived: Alford 3:41 p.m.; Leslie 3:41 p.m.; Patel 4:05 p.m.).

II. Ms. Anthony called for comments from the general public. There were none.

III. Ms. Anthony referred to the Consent Docket: Document #74 – Approval of Minutes of April 20, 2017 Meeting; Document #75 - Acceptance of Review of Expenditures for April 2017; Document #76 – Contract Awards & Purchases.

Ms. Anthony called for a motion.

Ms. Fran Cory moved to accept the consent docket. Mr. Jim Shonts seconded. Questions and discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. Ms. Anthony referred to the Committee Reports: Document #77 – Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action: Report and Recommendations from the Long-Range Planning Committee meeting, April 24, 2017.

Mr. Rogers reported the Long-Range Planning Committee discussed recent requests for new library service outlets in the Spencer and Gatewood Communities. Due to the recent requests and to plan for future requests, Morgan Jones, Manager of Planning and Assessment will facilitate the completion of an in-house needs assessment. The needs assessment will establish minimum levels of service, performance, and cost implications for libraries within the system. Once the needs assessment is complete, the Library will engage a third-party to complete a Cost Benefit Analysis on any new library request received. Mr. Rogers reviewed the estimated timelines for the completion of the needs assessment and cost benefit analysis. Questions and Discussion followed.

Mr. Rogers referred to and explained the Oklahoma City General Obligation Bond Capital Projects List, which has been refined since the Long-Range Planning Committee first approved it in April 2016. The four projects, if approved, will be included in the OKC 2017 General Obligation Bond Election. Questions and discussion followed. Mr. Rogers will contact the City for clarification on how the projects will be listed on the ballot.

The motion coming from the Long-Range Planning Committee is to approve the OKC General Obligation Bond Project List. A motion coming from committee requires no second. No further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

V. Ms. Anthony referred to Document #78 – Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action: Report and Recommendations from Joint Meeting of the Administrative & Personnel Committee and Finance Committee.

Mr. Coffey reported the Finance Committee met and reviewed the recommendations from the Administrative and Personnel Committee regarding the Benefits proposal.

Mr. Coffey called on Ms. Stephany Dowd, Benefits Manager to provide additional information regarding the annual benefits process and timeline. Questions and discussion followed.

Mr. Coffey stated the Finance Committee recommends that the Commission incorporate the funds for the benefits recommendations into the FY 2017-18 budget and that the Commission, by approval of the estimate of needs, approve the plan changes in accordance with the funding level. A motion coming from committee required no second. No further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Anthony referred to Mr. Hugh Rice to provide the report from the Administrative and Personnel Committee.

Mr. Rice provided information on the previous process used for the annual evaluation of the executive director. In previous years one survey was used for the Commission and Leadership Team to evaluate the executive director. Since there were several questions that did not apply to both groups, the committee asked that two separate surveys be drafted; one for each group to better evaluate the executive director. The A & P Committee reviewed the surveys and discussed including all staff in the evaluation process. The committee decided to add a brief third survey, which would be sent to all staff who are not part of the Leadership Team. Discussion followed.

Mr. Rice stated the motion coming from the Administrative and Personnel Committee is to approve the recommendation that the Executive Director evaluation consist of three separate surveys; one for Commission, one for Leadership Team, and one for all other employees who are not on the Leadership Team to ensure that every MLS employee gets a chance for input. A motion coming from committee requires no second. No further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. Ms. Anthony asked for comments from Commission members.

VII. The next regularly scheduled meeting will be held at the Ronald Norick Downtown Library on June 15, 2017 at 3:30 p.m.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:17 p.m.

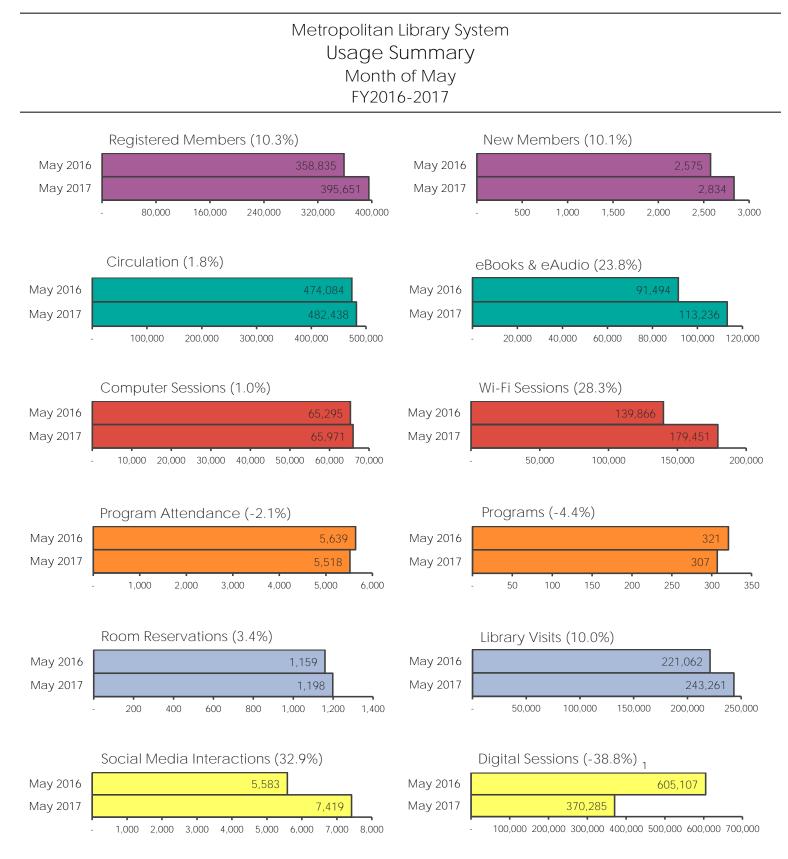

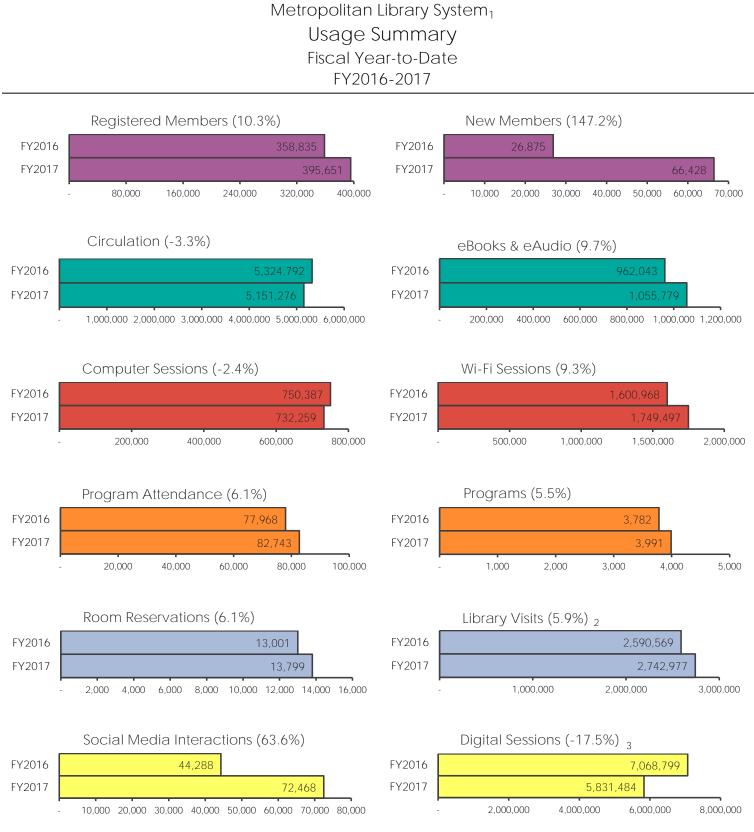
Metropolitan Library System Plan for Wage/Salary Increases for FY2017-18 DRAFT

To address the transition to a single common appraisal and annual performance wage/salary increase, the Library's Leadership Team proposes the following:

- Beginning July 1, 2017, we will suspend the formal performance management system for one year.
- All staff with anniversary dates between July 1, 2017, and October 31, 2017, will be awarded a 2% wage/salary increase on their anniversary; on November 1, 2017, they will be awarded an additional X% cash bonus*.
- All staff with an anniversary date after October 31, 2017, will be awarded a 2% wage/salary increase plus an additional X% cash bonus on November 1, 2017.
- Staff who are redlined or have reached the top of the current pay grade for their position will be awarded their increase as a lump sum bonus, in accordance with SH 110. These bonuses are earned at the rate of three-fourths of the applicable wage/salary increase percentage of annual base pay.
- From July 1, 2017- June 30, 2018, all staff will learn and practice the new performance management system developed by the Singer Group. No formal assessments will be recorded during this time. We will reinstate the formal assessment program during the beginning of FY2018-19 with a single common annual review date for all staff.
- *X = amount determined by Library Administration and approved by the Library Commission during the final budget process in August/September 2017. The amount determined will be based on available funds.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

JUNE 2017

In order to provide you with the information you need to govern the Library, I will break this report into several sections: 1) Projects, outlining work we're planning and implementing; 2) Personnel, providing you with information about our staff and volunteers; and 3) other Items of Interest, which may include news about financial, service, or other issues impacting the Library or the Commission. I will provide the Commission with an update during the monthly meeting when new or important information is available, and I may touch on other issues not discussed in the written report, but I will not read the report -- your time is too valuable for that. Of course, I will invite any and all questions you might have, and I look forward a lively exchange at the meeting next week.

1. Projects

Construction

• Bethany Library

The City of Bethany voted on Tuesday, June 6th to move forward with the construction project, authorizing city staff to begin the bid process by which the general contractor will be identified. As I previously reported, the city intends for the bid opening to be scheduled for the week of July 5th. We will attempt to schedule a Long-Range Planning Committee meeting the following week to review the bids and prepare any potential changes prior to the Bethany City Council meeting on July 18.th The LRPC will make its recommendations (if any) to the full Commission on July 20th, at it's regular meeting at the Patience Latting Northwest Library. The City Council may call a special meeting to approve the contractor bid on or about July 24th. I also wanted to remind you that the ground-breaking for the project has been scheduled for Saturday, August 12th, and we will share more information in the weeks and months to come. Although it is still too early to know much about the opening of the new library, we are currently hoping for an October 2018 move in date. A copy of the presentation made to the city council is provided as part of this packet.

• Capitol Hill Library

While the Capitol Hill Library project continues ahead of schedule, it would not be a construction project without an issue or two. We are considering an option that would place several electric floor boxes in concrete instead of using a raised floor system due to the fact that the floor is not level in one section of the building. While this would limit our flexibility in years to come, using concrete would be a less expensive approach that resolving it by attempting to raise the flooring system. On a positive note, Internal plumbing, and electrical conduit is 95% complete, as is interior drywall, allowing some of the painting to begin. Exterior brick work is 99% complete, and the windows have been installed (but not completely secured). Ceramic tile work has begun, and the duct work for HVAC is 95% complete with the rooftop units scheduled for installation in the next two weeks (just in time for hot weather!). The parking lot is about 2/3 of the way complete. One section at the main parking lot entrance will need to be removed and re-poured. The city was not happy with the slope. The building is now considered "Dried-In" but not yet 100% secure (lockable doors have not been installed yet). Work has begun on the retaining wall that will separate the library and the bank parking lots.

I will be attending the August 3rd meeting of the Capitol Hill Civic Group at the Grill on the Hill to discuss progress, and we hope that we will be able to provide tours to the group afterward. I would invite any of you who wish to attend the meeting to join me (please let Maria know).

Executive Director's Report MLC FY 2016-17 June 15, 2017

Orders for the furnishings, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E) have been placed, and vendors were notified that we are currently planning for an installation date of Aug 7-11 for shelving and systems furniture and Aug 14-18 for all other furniture. Substantial completion date is scheduled to be August 2017. Thanks to Project Coordinator Steve Butts for providing this information.

• Ronald J. Norick Downtown Library

The monument sign for the Ronald J. Norick Downtown Library was placed this week. The original sign was removed as part of the Project 180 work (that replaced all of the concrete between the library and Park Avenue), and our Facilities Maintenance staff have been working to complete the design and installation for several months.

The initial engineering report to determine the water intrusion point at the Downtown library was inconclusive and additional testing will be required. The testing will not require closure of the building, the main entrance or effect the pedestrian traffic on Park Avenue. Access will be performed on the 3rd floor roof. We are attempting to determine if the skylights are where the water is getting into the facility.

The streetcar project began this week along Hudson Avenue, just south of the Park/Hudson intersection on our side of the street. The contractor is relocating utilities. Construction of the aptly names "Library" stop will require the temporary closure of the in-wall book drop along Hudson, while the drive up for the book drop will be permanently eliminated as part of construction. A loading zone type parking spot will be added to enable members to continue to use the book drop, and it will remain open for walk-up traffic.

• Patience Latting Northwest Library

As the sign at the Patience Latting Northwest Library will be lit, we were waiting for the electrical contractor to complete the service install to the sign. He provided service to the sign footing earlier this week, and the final install is scheduled for this week or next.

Rudy Construction has completed the entrance surface replacement, curb art area, east channel, and the majority of the north channel. They will begin working on the Children's Patio granite extraction later this week. The bollard replacement is also part of Rudy's work, and has been scheduled in sections to enable the parking lot to remain as open and usable as possible through the summer months. All portions of the project are scheduled for completion in June.

Ralph Ellison Library

Although we had hoped to have the HVAC system upgraded prior to summer reading this year, the project bids were issued on June 8th, with bid opening and award scheduled June 20th. City Council is scheduled to approval the successful contractor on July 18th, and with a project duration of 120 days, this will place project completion at November 25, 2017. As an interim measure to protect the existing HVAC system, our HVAC controls contractor -- ES2 -- will proceed with the controls upgrade installation to prevent catastrophic failure of the new compressor installed last year. Pricing for 5 Ton portable air conditioning units for lease/purchase has been secured to prevent facility closure.

• Choctaw Library

Library staff have received bids to install and commission at Choctaw three HVAC units previously in place at old Bethany Library. The project should be completed with minimal impact to the facility's normal operations, and we expect to give the notice to proceed immediately upon contract acceptance. The Library and the city will share the cost of the installation.

Summer Reading

The Metro Library System kicked off the 2017 Summer Reading Program on Thursday with the Build a Better World campaign. With the goal of engaging more than 28,000 Oklahoma Countians, Edmond and Ralph Ellison libraries kicked off the event with launch parties (with Belle Isle's planned for June 6th) aimed at increasing awareness and engaging kids and parents of all ages. The Edmond event alone garnered more than 200 attendees. Pointing out one of the underlying reasons for our annual campaign, Teen Services Coordinator Emily Williams wrote a great blog post about reducing the impact of the "Summer Slide," which – on average – can rob children of nearly two months of their reading progress. She included a list of ten things we can do to promote reading during the months kids spend away from school. The addition of the ONEcard service (every student in OKCPS able to use their school ID as their library card) will enable us to assess how student reading changes for those who use the library (as compared to those who do not), and will provide us with a solid platform for adding more districts next year to the program. Reading to Dogs - a popular program that has been embraced across the system and which provides children with a low stress read aloud method – was highlighted in the Oklahoman this weekend. Several of you emailed or texted me about the photos of the Midwest City program – they were truly inspiring! Every week for the next two months I will share a bit with you about the Build a Better World Summer Reading campaign. It's not too late to add your #IReadBecause photo and phrase to the twitter/Facebook-sphere ... Remember to send it to Maria or share it with @MetroLibraryOK.

OKC 2017 GO Bond Election

As many of you know, the Commission approved at its meeting on May 30th four projects for the OKC 2017 General Obligation Bond election. A new 24,000 sqft library facility is proposed on the Southwest Side for Almonte, while Belle Isle, Ralph Ellison, and the Ronald J. Norick Downtown libraries are slated for renovations/expansions. The Oklahoman (via NewsOK) covered the story as did the Journal Record. The Oklahoma City Council has approved the election for September 12th, and we will be providing the Commission, the staff, and the public more information about all four projects in the weeks and months to come.

ReadOKC Reading Room

This week, our partnership with ReadOKC launched another win for central Oklahoma City -- the opening of the ReadOKC Reading Room at Penn Square Mall. This is a great opportunity for children to read while at the mall with their families and will be great exposure for the initiative. The Reading Room is located on the second floor of the west end of the Mall next to Dillard's. The Friends of the Library generously donated over 1,000 books for all ages! Kids can lounge on fun bean bag chairs while comfortably reading a book of their choice. The reading room will be open through July 16th until 6pm.

Warr Acres Support Beam / Village Water Line / Nicoma Park Mildew Smell

I wanted to let you know about a few issues that have popped up recently at our libraries. While performing regular inspections at Warr Acres Library, our maintenance staff located a steel beam that was showing some significant (but not dangerous) corrosion. We have contacted the city, and they have brought in a specialist to complete the replacement process. The Village Library experienced a major water line break over the Memorial Day holiday. According to those who witnessed the incident, the line

feeding the fire control system ruptured, sending water and mud 80 feet into the air. Facilities maintenance staff worked with city staff to shut the water off and we had the problem resolved before we opened back up on Tuesday. The Nicoma Park Library has suffered from a water collection problem for several years, and while we thought we had it taken care of, the mildew smell that accompanied it has returned. Caused by run-off from an adjacent city-owned property, the water drains to a spot beneath the library and gives off a brackish smell. Director of Faculties Maintenance Curtiss Ray is working with the Nicoma Park mayor to identify next steps, and we will share additional information as we have it. As always, a big thanks goes out to our maintenance staff who do a great job of mitigating every issue we throw at them everyday – and even on holidays! Thanks folks.

Pilot Projects Update

Although this item was reported last month, we did not have the opportunity to present the associated staff report, due to the postponement of the May Commission meeting. Because we will be presenting the Commission with the staff report this month, I wanted to again provide you with the information about our pilot projects.

Earlier this year, the Library's Leadership Team solicited pilot projects ideas from staff with the intention of funding innovative services that could be scaled for system-wide delivery. Two resulting projects included in-library checkouts of laptop computers for Almonte Library and multi-week lending programs of tablet/eBook readers and WiFi hotspots for Choctaw and Warr Acres libraries. In an attempt to decrease the wait times for desktop computers while also increasing member satisfaction and retention among members of our "Staying Connected" cluster (the segment of our member population who use public technology), Almonte members will be given the opportunity to checkout two different styles of laptops – Microsoft-enabled laptops and Google-powered Chromebooks. Each device can be borrowed for a period of two hours and can be taken and used at any table, chair, or corner of the floor the member finds comfortable.

At Choctaw and Warr Acres, members can borrow Kindle Fires and mobile wifi hotspots for four weeks. In addition to testing the concept of lending non-traditional devices, the project will provide wifi to diverse communities in which many families are without broadband service at home. In Warr Acres, 40-60% of households go without broadband connectivity, while at Choctaw this number falls to 20-40%. Providing access to digital technologies will facilitate greater access at home to Library services, and will fulfill the tenet of the Library Unbound plan which focus on Living Smarter, Working Smarter, and Living Smarter.

Both projects got underway this week in "soft launch" mode to work out any kinks in the system. Staff will be implement a marketing campaign beginning next week and we will provide the Commission with information at the meeting on June 15th.

Alignment Project Progress

On Tuesday, May 30th, the first round of the Alignment transitions started, with most of the Member Services staff shifting into their new roles. The feedback I received through managers and from frontlines staff was that the transition has proceeded smoothly. Staff members jumped into their new assignments (and libraries, in the few cases where individuals were transferred) with optimistic enthusiasm. I specifically heard from two staff members who expressed a lot of positivity about their new surroundings and colleagues, and both are looking forward to learning new skills that build on their talents and strengths. As we have said repeatedly, this is a process not a switch, and it will take time for everyone to fully align to the changes, but if the first week is any indication, the process will be successful.

Unexpected Opportunity for Land Acquisition

Last month I reported that we had an opportunity to acquire some property to the southwest of the Service Center. After visiting the site and estimating the work that would need to be done to make it habitable as library office and storage space, we determined that it would not be in the Library's best interest to pursue the purchase. We talked with a developer who expressed interest in potentially buying the building and leasing all or some of it back to us on an annual basis or as a lease to own option. We will provide the Commission with more information on this initiative, should it prove to be a direction of interest for us in the future.

Mission of ReadOKC is to create culture of literacy

r. Seuss has many words of wisdom, but none more so than what he says about reading: "The more you read, the more things you'll know. The more you know, the more places you'll go." To focus on developing a culture of reading for Oklahoma City Public Schools students and the community, the OKCPS Compact recently launched ReadOKC.

The Oklahoma City Public Schools Compact, made up of the City of OKC, the Greater OKC Chamber, United Way of Central Oklahoma, The Foundation for Oklahoma City Public Schools and Oklahoma City Public Schools, organized last year to assist OKCPS with key areas that require resources and community assistance. Literacy and reading was identified as the group's first project and evolved into ReadOKC.

The mission of Read-OKC is to create a



culture of reading and literacy in Oklahoma City, beginning with our students. As part of the Great Commitment (the OKCPS strategic plan), OKCPS is working to ensure every student will meet literacy and numeracy criteria for successful transitions throughout elementary school. This happens through reading, both in school and out, and requires the engagement of students, families and the entire community.

A ReadOKC task force formed late last year with about 50 community and business leaders meeting to develop a comprehensive reading plan to initially focus on pre-K through sixth grade OKCPS students, broadening to all grades

and all community members. Education partners from Scholastic Literacy Resources (book fairs and so much more), myOn reader (think Netflix for books, digital reading and automated comprehensive tracking) and the Metropolitan Library System, (who has developed an easy access library card for OKCPS students that only requires a student ID) have joined many other community partners to push visibility, outreach and access for ReadOKC.

Along with ReadOKC, a summer reading event has launched called, Get in the Game. Students have been given a goal of reading 1,200 minutes this summer, which equates to 20 minutes per day. The goal of Get in the Game is to reach students where they are, whether it is at summer school, a metro library, Boys and Girls Clubs, at church or a Food Bank summer feeding site. The opportunities are endless and community organizations who reach kids in the summer will play a huge part in the success of this program.

Data shows that kids who read during the summer greatly reduce "summer slide," which is a loss of reading skills. Summer slide can happen across demographics, but the impact of summer slide on students from low-income households with access to books is remarkable. Those who read show a 24.15 percent gain vs a nearly 10 percent loss of reading skills by low-income students without access to books.

It's a fact that students' academic success is greatly increased when they read, and reading to learn is critical. Reading because you love it is optimal as it expands an individual's world view in a way that we need for all our citizens. ReadOKC allows the entire community to be part of our children's, so please Get in the Game! Library.

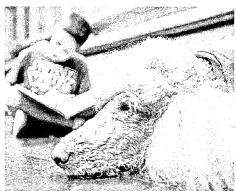

Websites help nonprofits link with volunteers

OKLAHOMA CITY – Cayla Lewis knows people in the nonprofit sector. She also knows the city is getting new residents nearly every day.

She wants to make it easier for organizations or events seeking volunteers to find the help they need. She started OKCVolunteers.org in late April.

"I wanted to do something that would be a bigger reach for all the organizations looking for volunteers," she said.

The website also helps recruit volunteers for events, such as the Peace, Love & Goodwill festival being held June 4. She said she hopes OKC Volunteers can make it less burdensome for people to get involved because the people can either email the organization or be directed to a sign-up website.

"It's easier and more approachable than having to fill out a big form," she said.

She said she knows there are other volunteer sign-up databases. She's met with Serve Oklahoma leaders, who work with the faith-based community. She said she wants to learn how OKC Volunteers can fill in the blanks with existing databases.

"Our goal would be to not limit events," she said. "We're not seeking anything specific like tutoring or mentoring, or one-time events. Anything goes."

People can fill out an online form to have their events posted on the web-

site's calendar. Lewis said there's an updated website in the works.

The United Way of Central Oklahoma has the volunteercentraloklahoma. org where people can search for opportunities, events and agencies seeking volunteers. Executive Director Debby Hampton said the organization has had tremendous success with partnering

volunteers with United Way agencies and other nonprofits.

"When someone wants to volunteer, they want to do it immediately," she said. "We can help them have a pretty immediate turnout."

Hampton said she's noticed that people's lives seem to be filled with events, so it's been more difficult to recruit volunteers. That's why it's crucial that the experience is a positive one, she said. United Way checks with the volunteer and the agency to make sure the match went well. One bad match could turn that volunteer away from an organization.

Oklahoma City's volunteer rate peaked in 2007 when 35 percent of residents said they gave their time to an organization, according to the Corporation for National and Community Service.

As of 2015, only 22.5 percent of Oklahoma City residents volunteer, while 41.9 percent of people donate to charity. The most popular activity is collecting, distributing or serving food.

By comparison, 28.4 percent of Tulsa residents said they volunteer, according to the same survey.

"In Oklahoma, we're such a disaster-prone state, I find that more people want to give back by giving time because they may not have the monetary means to write a check," Hampton said.

She said United Way has seen itself how important volunteers are for an organization. It takes about 250 people for the organization's allocation process, where it sorts through the needs of its partner agencies. That's 250 salaries the organization doesn't have to pay, which can go to serving central Oklahoma.

"Volunteers are the lifeblood of any organization," she said.

New Bethany library to incorporate community requests in design plans

BETHANY – Officials are looking at a mid-August construction start for Bethany's new public library, to be funded largely from an \$8.1 million bond that voters approved in April 2016.

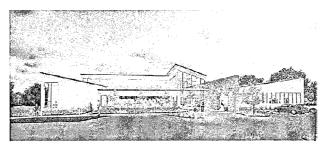
Contractors are expected to begin bidding on the project in June, following final approval of architectural plans for the library to be built on the site of Bethany's nowclosed library at 3510 N Mueller Ave.

Library operations are housed presently at a temporary location at 7941 NW 23.

Officials will open bids on the 23,000-squarefoot library project at 2 p.m. July 6, said City Manager J.D. Cox, with a contract to be awarded that month. Groundbreaking and start of construction is set for Aug. 12, he said.

Ward 2 Councilwoman Arlita Harris, who chairs the library steering committee, said the committee is pleased with the construction cost estimate.

"It came in right where we wanted it to be," she said. "If the bids come in

that way, it will be a wonderful thing."

The construction contract will include demolition of the old library, which closed in February. The new library will occupy the same site but will be about triple the size.

Among features to be offered in the new library, Harris said, are conference space for groups of 100 or more, a larger collection of materials, a drive-up book drop, a quiet reading area and a special section for children's programs.

The new library also will include a teen center, large picture windows and outdoor reading porches. The campus will include walking trails, improvements to the nearby pond, a new playground, additional parking with wider spaces and extensive landscaping. Construction will take 12 to 18 months.

Cox said the library was designed to incorporate many of the requests made during public meetings conducted before the bond election.

The Bethany Library is part of the Metropolitan Library System, which oversees staffing, selection of materials and day-today library operations, and is providing about \$2 million toward the new library.

Cox praised the leadership of Harris, Metropolitan Library System Director Tim Rogers, Bethany's library consultant Todd Olberding and others.

"An enormity of work has been completed to bring this project to this point of final approval to go out for construction," Cox said. "It has truly been

a team effort."

Harris said the presentation to the city council on June 5 will be led by Denelle Wrightson, director of library architecture for Dewberry Architects, the firm chosen by the city council. Harris described Wrightson as one of the world's foremost library architects, having designed 250 to 300 libraries.

Bethany's old 8,400square-foot library was opened in 1965, and while one of the metro system's busier libraries, it was one of the smallest. It did not meet handicap-accessibility requirements, lacked energy-efficiency, had little meeting space, and its mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems were dated.

"We hope that this new and much-improved library will increase our sense of community and provide residents with a wonderful place to spend time with family and neighbors," said Nikki Phipps, Bethany public information officer.

Voters gave the bond proposal 71.7 percent approval, with the question winning by a vote of 1,022-404.

Cornett asked parents and others in the community to encourage reading.

"Creating a healthy community isn't just about economic development and physical fitness," he said. "We need students with healthy minds, and reading is the best kind of exercise to prepare them for everything they want to do."

Mary Mélon, president and CEO of The Foundation for Oklahoma City Public Schools and chair of ReadOKC, thanked the sponsors and community partners for supporting ReadOKC.

"From the companies and nonprofits who supplied people for our committees to the businesses providing safe spaces to read this summer, ReadOKC is truly a community effort," she said. "I'm proud to live in a city that comes together so powerfully to support our children."
