

Belle Isle Collection Scavenger Hunt – updated 8/22/24

Doing a walk through to explore the collection should take you about 30-60 minutes to complete. The purpose of walking through the collection is for you to spend time learning the collection before we start shelving training. If you cannot find the answer to these questions, feel free to ask a fellow staff member for assistance.

Take note of the spine labels including any genre or stickers. When you look at these spine labels and/or stickers, what do you notice about the collection you are in?

Different genres include Mystery, Science Fiction, Short Story, and Western. In Children's we also have Sports.

- How are the Large Print fiction genres and nonfiction books organized? Are different Large Print genres interfiled or together?
- Look at the Westerns. Where are the regular versus Large Print Westerns?
- Find the Harlequin paperback books. (Hint: Under "H's" in large and regular print fiction). What do you notice about how they are organized?
- Where are the adult graphic novels? The YA? The Juvenile? The Tween? What about nonfiction graphic novels in each of these areas?
- Where are the Music CDs for children and adults? How are the CDs organized?

- Find fiction and nonfiction audiobooks for different age groups. Are different genres interfiled or together?
- Where are Sequoyah books? How can you tell what age group Sequoyahs belong to?
- Do we have a World Language section or are they interfiled? Where are bilingual books? (Hint: Bilingual items have genre stickers on them).
- Investigate the children's area and identify the several different sections. What are the differences?
- How are our feature films for different age groups divided throughout the library? What about Adult Non-Fiction DVDs (such as documentaries)?
- Where are the Young Adult books? What are the different types of books? Which are interfiled?
