

Explore the Collection

This process should take you about an hour to do. The purpose in doing this is for you to spend time learning the collection. If you cannot find the answer to these questions, feel free to ask a fellow staff member for assistance.

Pay close attention to the spine labels, genre stickers (located on the spine), location of items, etc.

Different genres are: Mysteries, Science Fiction and Westerns

- What do you notice about each collection? Are different genres interfiled?
- What is interesting about adult graphic novels? Where are the adult graphic novels?
- Where is the Young Adult (YA) collection? What do you notice about it? Note the differences in the spine label vs. a genre sticker.
- What is the difference between Juvenile graphic novels vs. Tween graphic novels?
- Where are Oversized items kept for children? How many Oversized collections are there in Children's?
- What is unique about how series are shelved in Adult vs. Children's?
- What do you notice about the Large Print collection?

- Do we have a Spanish section or are they interfiled? (Hint: The Spanish items have genre stickers on them)
- Are Biographies (some also have genre stickers) interfiled or do they have their own special section?
- Where are the CD's for both children and adult? Where do we keep the holiday CD's?
- Do we have a non-fiction DVD section? If yes, is there a non-fiction DVD in both Adults and Children?
- What do you notice about the Audiobooks collections?
