HOW-TO GUIDE ANDROID DEVICES



Android is Google's mobile operating system that can be found on tablets and smart phones. Android devices are usually less expensive than their Apple counterparts.

There are many different manufacturers of Android-based smart phones and tablets, including Google, Amazon, Asus, Samsung, HTC and Motorola just to name a few. Features, use and performance are fairly similar from one device to another. Think of how many different brands of desktops and laptops use the Windows operating system (Dell, HP, Acer, Lenovo, etc.) If you

- OverDrive READ eBooks (using the browser)
- OverDrive Listen audiobooks (using the browser)
- EPUB eBooks and MP3 audiobooks (using the OverDrive app)
- Kindle eBooks (using the Kindle app)


If you have an earlier version of Android, visit <u>http://app.overdrive.com/android-eula-v2_6.html</u> to install the app.

- 1. Find and install the OverDrive app from the Play Store.
- 2. Once the OverDrive app is installed, find it on your device and open it by tapping its icon:

- 3. You will be prompted to create an OverDrive account that will synchronize your reading \listening progress across multiple devices.
- 4. Once your account is created, you can download eBooks and audiobooks:
 - On the OverDrive home screen, tap the plus sign to find a library.
 - Enter your zip code to find your library. Tap your library's name then tap the star icon beneath it to save it as a favorite.
 - Tap the back arrow to go back to the home screen (shown at the right) and tap the plus sign to access the Metropolitan Library System Digital Catalog.
 - Tap Sign In and enter your full library card number and your full last name.
 - *OPTIONAL*: To change your lending period from the default of 7 days, tap the Account icon then tap on Settings. Do this before you borrow a title.
 - Browse or search the Digital Catalog to find the eBook or audiobook you want.
 - Once you have found your title, tap on its cover and then tap **Borrow**.



- Tap Go To Checkouts, (if you're checking out an eBook, tap Download (select one format), then select EPUB eBook) then tap Confirm & add to app.
- To read/listen to the title, tap the OverDrive icon at the top left then tap Bookshelf.

- 1. An Amazon account is required to download Kindle titles. If you do not already have an Amazon account, go to http://www.amazon.com to create one before downloading Kindle titles to your device.
- 2. Find and install the Amazon Kindle app from the Play Store.
- 3. Once the Kindle app is installed, find it on your device and open it by tapping the icon:



- 4. Register your device with Amazon by entering the email and password you used to create your Amazon account.
- 5. You can now search for and download Kindle titles by opening the browser on your device and going to http://emedia.metrolibrary.org.
- 6. Tap Sign In and enter your full library card number and your full last name.
- 7. Search the digital catalog for Kindle titles. To narrow your search to only Kindle titles, tap the **magnifying glass** icon, tap the **Advanced Search** link and then choose Kindle Book from the **All Formats** menu.
- 8. When the desired title is found, tap on its cover then tap the **Borrow** button.
- 9. Tap Go To Checkouts, tap Download (select one format), tap Kindle Book, then tap Confirm & get Kindle Book.
- 10. Your browser will redirect you to Amazon's site. If necessary, sign in to your Amazon account.
- 11. Select your Kindle app in the **Deliver to:** drop down menu then tap the **Get Library book** button.
- 12. If prompted, sign in to your Amazon account.
- 13. Leave the browser and open the Kindle app.
- 14. Open the Kindle menu and choose Sync & Check for Items.
- 15. The title will appear in your Kindle library.

OverDrive Read

The easiest way to read an eBook from OverDrive is to do so in your browser. Look for "OverDrive READ" in the Available formats section for titles that can be read in the browser. Reading an eBook in your browser does not require the creation of an OverDrive account and here are some devices that support OverDrive Read:

- Apple iPhone\iPad\iPod Touch (iOS version 7 or higher)
- Android phone \tablet (version 4 or higher with Chrome, not the stock Android browser)
- Kindle Fire HD 7 and Fire HDX
- Microsoft Surface tablets
- NOOK HD and Samsung Galaxy Tab 4
- Windows 7, 8, or 10 (best with Chrome)

Note: OverDrive Read eBooks may not work on older Android devices, like the NOOK Color and early Kindle Fires. To test whether your device can read an eBook in the browser, try reading this sample at http://bit.ly/metroharry. If the book opens, you're set!

You can also read an eBook on a Windows, Linux or Mac computer running one of the following browsers:

- Chrome
- Firefox
- Internet Explorer (version 10 or higher)
- Safari

Note: OverDrive Read is not currently compatible with Microsoft's Edge browser.

STEPS

- 1. To check out a book, tap on the cover image and then tap Borrow.
- 2. Enter your full library card number and your full last name and tap Sign In.
- 3. Tap the Read (in your browser) button to begin reading the eBook.

Returning OverDrive Read eBooks

- 1. Sign in to your eMedia account with your **full** library card number and **full** last name.
- 2. Tap the Account icon.
- 3. Tap the **Return Title** button.

NOTE: Once you have downloaded an eBook, you will no longer have this **Return Title** option available. Adobe EPUB eBooks can be returned through the OverDrive app. Kindle Books can be returned through the Manage Your Kindle section on Amazon.com.

OverDrive Listen

The easiest way to listen to an audiobook from OverDrive is to do so in your browser. Look for "OverDrive Listen" in the Available formats section for titles that can be listened to in the browser. Listening to an audiobook in your browser requires an Internet connection but does not require the installation of software nor the creation of an OverDrive account. OverDrive Listen is supported on the following devices:

- Apple iPhone\iPad\iPod Touch (iOS version 7 or higher)
- Android phone \tablet (version 4.1 or higher) using the Chrome browser (you cannot use the stock browser)
- Chromebook (with the Chrome OS)
- Mac OSX 10.9 or newer
- Windows 7 or newer

You'll also need a current version of one of these web browsers:

- Chrome
- Firefox
- Internet Explorer 10 (or above)
- Safari

STEPS

- 1. To check out an audiobook, tap on the cover image and then tap Borrow.
- 2. Enter your **full** library card number and your **full** last name and tap **Sign In**.
- 3. Tap the Listen (in your browser) button to begin listening to the audiobook.

Returning OverDrive Listen eBooks

- 1. Sign in to your eMedia account with your **full** library card number and your **full** last name.
- 2. Tap the Account icon.
- 3. Tap the **Return Title** button.

NOTE: Once you have downloaded an audiobook, you will no longer have the **Return Title** option available. MP3 audiobooks will have to be returned through the OverDrive app.

FREEGAL FOR ANDROID

Download 5 free and DRM-free MP3s every week to your Android device with Freegal. Choose from a catalog of millions of songs and thousands of videos.

- 1. Find and install the **Freegal** app from the Play Store.
- 2. Once the Freegal app is installed, find it on your device and open it by tapping its icon:
- 3. Enter your City and tap the **Go** button.
- 4. Tap Metropolitan Library System.
- 5. Enter your **full** library card number and your **full last name** as your pin.
- 6. Tap the **Login** button.

- 7. Search to find specific songs or videos or tap the Browse button.
- 8. Once you're ready to download a song/video, tap the download icon: **Q**

IMPORTANT: The songs videos you download using the Freegal app will be available in the **Recent Downloads** section on Metro's Freegal website so when you log into that site using your computer, you can download those files to your computer. The songs videos you initially download on your computer are **not** available to the Freegal app. Also, data rates may apply when downloading songs videos to your Android device.

ZINIO FOR ANDROID

Zinio provides instant access to hundreds of popular magazines. You can read the magazines online in a browser or download them for offline reading on your Apple device. No limits, no waiting, and you can keep the issues as long as you want!

- Visit <u>http://zinio.metrolibrary.org</u> and click Create New Account at the top right to sign up for a Zinio for Libraries account. Find the magazine(s) you want, tap on it, and then tap on Checkout. In the pop up window, you can click Start Reading to start reading the magazine now in your browser.
- 2. If you would like to download the magazine to read offline, tap the **Android** link to get the new app to read the magazine offline.
- 3. Once the Zinio app is installed, open it and tap **Log In.** Proceed to enter your country, state, and library system name.
- 4. Sign in using the same email and password you used in Step 1.
- 5. Once signed in, you'll see the magazine(s) you've checked out. Tap on any magazine's cover to download it to your Android device.

NOTE: Data rates may apply when downloading magazines.
