

He Should Be Messin'

he early oilfields of Oklahoma gave rise to the wildcatter, a peculiar character known to be a fearless maverick who struck it rich by drilling holes based on nothing more than a gut instinct.

Lee Hazlewood, maybe the biggest pop music legend you've never heard of, was born in Mannford, Oklahoma – a town so small, he said, they had to share the town drunk with

next town over. He only lived in the state for six years but Lee spent most of his summers in Oklahoma with his oilman father. He wasn't destined for a career in oil, but he definitely learned the ways of Oklahoma's wildcatters.

After a tour in Korea, Lee tried selling insurance in Oklahoma City but ended up bouncing around the west, eventually landing a job as a DJ in Phoenix. He flourished there as an early rock producer – with no formal musical training – and began blurring the lines between country and rock while creating magic from the soundboard. His most notable success was the echo-driven reverb sound of

guitar legend Duane Eddy and a lot of Phil Spector's success was due to the time he spent learning under Hazlewood.

Ultimately, it was the British Invasion of the early 60s that allowed Hazlewood to become a legendary musical wildcatter. Public taste shifted to simple melodies with little emphasis on musicianship or lyrical acumen, but Hazlewood went the opposite direction. He recorded solo albums in the early 60s with his own material using those same simple melodies but also obscure, context-laden lyrics based on his acute knowledge of human nature. Or as he put it – Model T melodies and Rolls Royce lyrics.

Hazlewood's solo work wasn't widely popular but musicians recognized its genius and by the mid-60s he was tapped to jumpstart the career of Nancy Sinatra. Hazlewood saw potential but famously gave her the advice (euphemistically paraphrased), "I want you to sing like a girl who dates truck drivers." Nancy and Lee built a respectable career after that which included a couple of chart-toppers like "These Boots

Are Made for Walkin" and "Sugar Town." The latter was the epitome of Hazlewood's genius. He later said he wrote the melody for the infectious pop tune with 6-year-olds in mind (and it does appear on some children's compilations) but the lyrics are about teenagers strung out on psychedelic drugs. Listen to it again with that in mind.

Hazlewood continually reinvented himself over the course of his career but always did things his own way. Since the 1970s he has been revered by the best record producers and musicians in the business from alt-country pioneers

like Gram Parsons to punk's Joe Strummer and rock's Nirvana. It will be well worth your time to explore his oeuvre on Grooveshark or watch videos of his work with Nancy Sinatra on YouTube. Just don't expect to find the clip of my sister and me dancing to "These Boots Are Made for Walkin" wearing our mom's wigs and go-go boots.

Kind of Kin By Rilla Askew

"Sweet" Georgia Brown Kirkendall is your run-ofthe-mill Oklahoma country girl. Except, her father is a felon for harboring undocumented immigrants. Her niece married an illegal alien before he was sent back to Mexico (oh, and they have a baby). Her nephew has come to live with her while his grandfather is in jail. And her son is a bully.

Things get even worse when her nephew disappears. While they worry about his safety, the ensuing manhunt threatens her niece's family. Sweet loves her family, but thinks they mostly brought their troubles on themselves. Then she begins to see in herself those old images of prejudice, white girls taunting black girls who want to attend their schools, the "same kind of kin." ("A little more than kin, and less than kind," as Shakespeare put it in *Hamlet*)

Then, within the tragedy, comes comic relief when

Sweet and her niece and family hole up in the church claiming sanctuary. Sides are drawn. Everyone has to choose. Sometimes it's surprising whose side you end up on and who your enemies turn out to be.

I love the inside jokes that only Oklahomans will catch. Sweet's maiden name is Brown (ain't-nobodygot-time-for-that) and the local TV reporter is Shoshone Ballanger.

Rilla Askew has won national and international acclaim with multiple awards and is the three-time recipient of the Oklahoma Book Award.

A Week in Winter

Reading the final book from author Maeve Binchy was almost an act of grieving. The talented Irish author passed away in July of 2012, leaving behind a plethora of loyal fans. Books are forever, so we won't essentially lose her, but there will be no more anticipation of her next manuscript.

The last of her Irish stories takes a group of strangers and weaves them in and out of each others' lives so well it's almost like reading a dance. I like her method of character development. She acquaints us with just enough of an understanding of the conflicts in her characters to make us feel as if we know them.

"Chicky" left her small town on the west coast of Ireland with the man of her dreams, but lived a lie for 20 years. During a visit home, she buys a decaying mansion

to refurbish so she can offer restful holidays by the sea to vacationers. In each chapter we meet the staff and guests for the opening week of the hotel. Nicola and Henry are married but disillusioned doctors; Anders is a talented musician, forced into the family business he hates; the Walls are disappointed second prize winners; and Freda whose psychic powers frighten her, are just some of the guests who share a week that changes lives.

I will miss Maeve Binchy.

Meg's father had always promised to take her to Florence someday, and he is finally ready for the longoverdue trip. Unfortunately, when Meg arrives in Florence, he is not there to meet her. Having no other choice, Meg goes to the apartment house where a couple of her travel-book writers live. They are not at home, but Sofia, who sent the chapters about Florence, lives in the same building. Sofia welcomes Meg and invites her to

There Once Lived a Girl Who Seduced Her Sister's Husband, and He Hanged Himself: Love Stories

by Ludmilla Petrushevskaya, trans. by Anna Summers

Petrushevskaya is a contemporary Russian writer. Her short stories are in the tradition of Chekhov, anecdotal in nature. If stories were sandwiches, one of hers would be a quarter of the whole, with the crust trimmed off. There is also a strong streak of Gogol's absurdity making a tangy

Are they really love stories? Depends on your definition. One is about a woman who invites home a brute of a fella who either treats her badly or ignores her completely, but he is the man of her dreams. The book's title is derived from a story called "Hallelujah, Family!" and is a throw-away line, an observation of the extraordinary that is barely noticed. Like this: "Nina Sergeevna was crossing the bridge when in front of her she noticed a tall woman who walked woodenly and

carried a pile of snow on her head."

There's a desire to communicate in these stories, but frequently the characters' words either add up to less than the whole, or a great deal too much:

"She wanted to tell them about the first time she took pills, when she went blind for twenty-four hours. The second time put her to sleep for two days, but the sixth time she woke up in the morning fresh as a daisy."

These are not straight-forward narratives, but they are quick reads and are like someone else's dreams. Not like hearing about another's dreams, but like dreaming them yourself.


Gold


Now Zoe and Kate both have a chance to go for gold on their home turf at the 2012 London Olympics, but they'll have to face off against each other first. And
