





Oklahoma Images

... At the Mint

world or just a couple of states over, émigrés pack more than a few belongings and a change of clothes when they move to a new land. Among other metaphorical baggage they also bring their foodways and traditions with them. You find this a lot in Oklahoma City's early history because, in 1889, everyone was from somewhere else.

Whether moving around the

raditions influenced the mayoral campaign of 1909 in a big way. The incumbent, moodily-named mayor, Henry Minor Scales, Jr., was born in Holly Springs, Mississippi. He spent his boyhood in genteel Nashville, Tennessee where he graduated from Vanderbilt University. An economic boom brought him to

Oklahoma City in 1901 as general manager for Prudential Insurance. He was a dapper southerner always dressed to perfection right down to his spats.

Scales was first elected in 1907, the year that brought statehood and prohibition to Oklahoma. Although welcomed by those on the farm, prohibition was unpopular in Oklahoma City so Mayor Scales turned a blind eye while many Oklahoma Cityans carried on just as before. Thus his policies of live and let live were the main topic when he ran for office a second time in 1909. His toughest opponent was Reverend E. O. Whitwell of Maywood Presbyterian who attacked Mayor Scales on his record,

"I will help defeat a bad man just as I will help elect a good one. [Mayor Scales will] wink at a law-violator if he puts a little money into the machinery to make it go."

Meanwhile the mayor's supporters painted the election as a battle between business and religion to which Rev. Whitwell replied, "Oklahoma City politics could use a little religion!" But Mayor Scales took a different tack when he addressed a crowd of five thousand voters one night during

the campaign. He stood up, asked for quiet, and admitted that he did occasionally break the law on prohibition. As the crowd's collective gasp rose to the podium, he implored that before they indicted him for his errant ways, to follow him down Memory Lane back to his old Tennessee home, "Where I sat so often with friends on the expansive

veranda, at the mint julep hour." He went on to pantomime making a mint julep for the crowd, "Each of us muddles a few sprigs of fresh mint, with a dash of sugar...," until he finished with, "we lift the glass, decorate it with mint and orange and lemon and a big red cherry—and we're off to the races! Oh, my friends, is anything more heavenly? To paraphrase the words of an illustrious Kentuckian, 'I'd rather be right with old Tennessee...than be Mayor!"

At the punch line, the crowd erupted into applause and laughter. Mayor Scales understood that even though the city was divided over the prohibition issue, he also knew that inside every beating heart was

a bit of longing for home. And it was likely that sentiment that carried him back into the mayor's office – by 600 votes.





Surviving Survival: The Art and Science of Resilience by Laurence Gonzales

Ever played the game "Would you rather?" Pick a scenario and imagine your attempts to survive: Would you rather be attacked by shark or bear? Be shipwrecked at sea or crash an airplane into a mountain peak? "Neither!" is not an option.

As Gonzales points out, surviving a traumatic event is only the first phase of a survival story. This is usually where the made-for-television movie ends, as the rescued victim beams triumphantly into the camera. The aftermath of such an experience, however, does not make for good television. Recovery can take years, if not a lifetime.

"In the brain, the cardinal rule is future equals past; what has happened before will happen again," says Gonzales. "In response to trauma, the brain encodes protective memories that force you to behave in the future the way you behaved in the past." The sight of blood, the smell of motor oil, the wail of an ambulance, anything that the brain associates with the past trauma can trigger new, unconscious behaviors now encoded in the brain.

What is the key to resilience? A successful survival journey begins with the survivor making a decision to reinvent herself. For Eileen, attacked by a crocodile, it was running saved her. Don, a survivor of the sinking of the Indianapolis, took up walking and golf. Traveling, learning a new language, pursuing a PhD -- all of these employ characteristics that have proved therapeutic for the traumatized or grief-stricken.

There's more, of course. Gonzales describes ten characteristics that contribute to successfully surviving a traumatic event, and then 12 more that can help those survivors successfully negotiate their lives in the aftermath. Fully explained in the last two chapters, I'll let you discover them for yourselves.

With her incredible book knowledge and sharply-honed survivor skills, Jana Hausburg is humanity's best chance in a zombie apocalypse. She is also the manager at the Capitol Hill Library.

Fifteen-year-old Bee's mother, Bernadette, has disappeared. To find out what happened, Bee compiles letters, bills, emails, even F.B.I. documents, interspersed with her own entertaining commentary.

It all starts when Bee asks for a family trip to Antarctica as her promised reward for good grades. Bernadette has become so antisocial that she has hired a virtual assistant in India to take care of most of her daily tasks, so you can imagine how apprehensive she is at the idea of a cruise.

She hates Seattle, where the family has lived since before Bee's birth, and also hates the fellow parents at Bee's private school, whom she calls "gnats." Before the move to Seattle, Bernadette had been a creative and reviewed by Elisabeth Wright

highly praised architect, but now she's on the verge of a breakdown.

Beyond just Bee and Bernadette, the novel is filled with a cast of interesting characters: the private school helicopter parents, Bee's tech guru father, the Victims Against Victimhood support group and so on.

At the heart of the novel, though, is the close-knit relationship between mother and daughter. The result is a fast-paced read that manages to be funny, smart, sweet and satiric.

The 100-Year-Old Man Who Climbed Out the Window and Disappeared

He was on the run from his own birthday party, another unusual thing for a 100 year old, not least because being 100 is pretty rare.

A story set in Sweden about a 100-year-old man who escapes from a nursing home does not sound like very appealing subject matter for a novel, but senior citizen Allan Karlsson's life is always full of surprises. As he points out in the story, he is very spry for his age and so spry that he was on the run from the nursing home.


From the moment he climbs out of the window into the flower beds and heads to the nearest bus station and hops on a bus, he sets off a whole string of events which include inadvertently making off with a suitcase full of illegal money (thirty seven and a half million crowns to be exact) that the owner will do anything to retrieve. The missing 100 year old man soon makes news headlines which lead to a full scale police search after a tip off from a lady on the same bus. So Allan is being

pursued both by the criminals who want to get their money back and by the police, turning the events into a black comedy.

Jonasson cleverly alternates chapters about the pursuit to find Allan with Karlsson's life story starting with details about his skill as an explosives expert. He has apparently been a key player in major historical events over the last 100 years, using his skills as a munitions expert and sharing meals with such figures as Stalin, Hitler, Churchill, Franco and Chairman Mao.

Green is associated with spring and rebirth, but going green in Victoria Kann's Emeraldalicious is fun any time of year! Following Pinkalicious, Goldalicious and Silvericious, Kann finds a way to recycle being "green" into a sweet story for children four and up.

Readers join Pinkalicious and her brother strolling in the park one day. Pink trips on the path; crushing her tiara and breaking her wand--so she creates a makeshift wand with a stick and an odd heart-shaped flower. Unbeknownst to Pink and Peter, the glittery flower enables the wand to have a mind of its own.

The children travel on to find their beloved park is now cluttered with trash and junk. Pink calls out for a throne to sit on when suddenly a throne made of

thrown-away items assembles before her eyes. Amazed, the children recreate the magical moment to discover the secret and what a 'love'ly secret it is.


While written for preschoolers, *Emeraldalicious* is still fun for the littlest wannabe readers, too. The Invisible War

In his documentary film The Invisible War director Kirby Dick exposes the elephant in the room for men and women in the military. The film investigates one of America's best kept secrets: rape and sexual abuse within the U.S. military.

Viewers will hear from many first person accounts individual stories, stories that are so profound they will leave viewers shaking their heads in sorrow and disbelief. Shockingly, sexual abuse is treated lightly and ineffectively at the command level, where the victim is more often than not blamed for the abuse. The viewer will learn that victims aren't always women, and the perpetrators are often protected by commanders. Even

in egregious proven cases, the victims find no recourse or assistance in dealing with the aftermath, many suffering psychological and physical harm, but are ineligible for medical or psychological treatment.

I recommend that everyone watch this documentary if they want to get a better understanding of recent policy changes and Congressional action.

"He can learn to do anything just by reading a book about how it works.


When everything started moving from dumb terminals to PCs, he jumped right in and developed windows-based clients for all of the library software."

... Discovering New Literary Treasures

Summer at MLS is the time for Steampunk, a branch of science fiction set in an alternative future that assumes steam continued as the main source of industrial power. No computers, no space flight, no mass communications. Sounds like heaven, right? Not usually. Here are a pair of titles to check out.

Major Tinker. *The Steampunk Gazette*. 306.1 / T589s

Steampunk is not just a literary subgenre—it's also a parallel culture, with its own clothing styles, faux weaponry, art, furniture, and gear of all sorts. The Gazette is an illustrated one-stop shop of steampunkery. The author is chair of the Victorian Steampunk Society (and as John Naylor, an archaeologist, historian, and television presenter in Britain). Take a look at this cornucopia of "retro-future inventions" and you may want to put a little Jules Verne in your life, too.

Resnick, Mike. *The Buntline Special: A Weird West Tale.* Science Fiction/RES

Resnick is an old hand at SF who proves here that he can learn new tricks with the best of them. Journey back to Tombstone, AZ. The year is 1881 and the reality is—your guess is as good as mine. Thomas Alva Edison lives in Tombstone and is trying to find a way to counteract Geronimo's magic. The Earp brothers and Doc Holiday join with Bat Masterson (so called because he turns into one after dark) to face up to The Thing That Was Once Johnny Ringo in a shootout at a corral where nothing is really all that OK. It's wild, it's fun, and the first in a series.
