

THE RUINS THAT WERE ROME

hen I was nineteen I made what previous generations of elites called The Grand Tour of Europe. The only difference was that I'm not elite and, given my budget, the trip

wasn't really that grand. In fact, I really can't write about the grandest part of the tour in this venue so I'll get to my point. I did a lot of walking and hitchhiking and every little hamlet I came upon featured directional signs to the local Roman ruins. After a few weeks of this I turned to my companion and asked, "How many things could the Romans possibly ruin?"

I get a similar feeling when I research these articles. Case in point: the Musical Art Institute. I've always adored

this classy edifice built between two frame houses at 124 NW 5th in 1912. When I set out to learn this building's story I planned on tracking down former students and describing the aural heights to which they rose in the musical world. I read about the lavish lobby and acoustically rich performance hall. I discovered that Maud Powell, America's first master violinist, performed there.

It strikes me that the Institute represented a quickly achieved maturity on the part of Oklahoma City. In a span of only twentyfive years (and really only about 10 years after the city moved out of its frontier phase) the city had produced middle and leisure classes with the means and interest to support a music and dance conservatory. It wasn't meant to last, though. While most of the faculty were trained in the great conservatories of Europe, they were also mostly young and headed for brighter futures in the



symphonies of larger cities. Add wartime belt-tightening and it seems that the cultural elites were just too ambitious.

> You thought I forgot about the Roman ruins. Well, during my research I tried to determine what happened to the building after the Institute closed in 1919. I had an inkling already; it seems that nearly every building in the city with any sizable meeting space eventually gravitated into the orbit of one of the many manifestations of Masonry. The Baptist White Temple I wrote about recently, the

Western National Bank, and even the Jewish Synagogue were just some of the repurposed facilities used by the Masons. This is remarkable to me because I thought these guys were master builders and I assumed they would create some magnificent structure to illustrate that fact. But I still had to find out about the Institute.

So I turned to the 1919 city directory. "Ack!" I cried. "How many buildings could the Masons..."

Larry "Buddy" Johnson has been with MLS since 1998. Not only a librarian at the Downtown Library, he is the brilliant mind behind the Oklahoma Images database which is a collection of pictures and essays that illustrate the history of central Oklahoma.

Death of a Gentle Lady by M. C. Beaton

Mrs. Gentle wasn't a terribly gentle lady. In fact, she was a tight-fisted meanie. She said horrible things to her middle-aged daughter and threatened to change her will. She kept her beautiful maid in a freezing upstairs cubicle and threatened to report her to the police for being an illegal alien. To the local community, however, she appeared to be all sugar and spice.

So begins the 24th book in the Hamish Macbeth series. M. C. Beaton, who also writes under the name Marion Chesney, is using a formula that has worked well to keep her fans happy. In each episode, there is at least one obnoxious person just asking to be murdered. Someone always takes care of that, and Hamish is off on another investigation.

Hamish is a constable in the highland Scottish village of Lochdubh. His immediate superior is

jealous of him and is always trying to undermine his efforts, forcing Hamish to work in the background. Fortunately, that's where he does his best work, and he always finds the clues that solve the case.

Hamish usually has a brief romantic interlude that indicates that marriage is imminent; however, he always manages to avoid that. Given that so many elements of each installment are much the same, it is surprising that each new episode still delights devoted fans. I am always eager to re-visit this picturesque place and hear Hamish questioning the familiar characters. May M. C. Beaton live long and write 24 more episodes.

Casey Affleck, Michelle Monaghan, Morgan Freeman, Ed Harris and Amy Ryan star in this detective story/morality play about the investigation into the disappearance of a fouryear old girl from her home in blue collar Boston. The movie asks its viewers to think about a most difficult question: when they don't coincide, which is more necessary, justice or the law?


Contemporary America has a thing for "family values," but how do you proceed when the values a family has are the wrong ones? What do you do when the obviously right thing contradicts the law?

Based on a novel by Dennis Lehane (*Mystic River*) and directed tautly by Ben Affleck, this is one of the most thoughtful crime dramas to come

along in years. The acting from all concerned is top notch and Amy Ryan should have taken home the Oscar for Best Supporting Actress. The older Affleck brother acquits himself well as first-time feature film director, building suspense all the way to the movie's shattering oh-no-he-didn't ending. Affleck is also absolutely fearless when it comes to showing places and attitudes in his home town that won't get him a commendation from the Boston Chamber of Commerce.

This is one you won't quickly forget.

Hoping to ease the feeling of emptiness for herself and her 9-year old son, Josh, they both go dog hunting and instantly fall in love with a five month old Cavalier King Charles Spaniel called George.

George turns out to be more of a handful than expected and any hope of a peaceful existence is shattered. Every morning Judith and Josh are awakened by piercing barking, and frequent trips to the vet make George more expensive than a Ferrari to boot!


The Last Apprentice series:

by Joseph Delaney

Finding books that appeal to teenage boys can be a challenge, but Joseph Delaney's *Last Apprentice* series delivers loads of chilling entertainment. Thomas Ward is the seventh son of a seventh son. This makes him eligible to serve as an apprentice to Old Gregory, the local Spook in charge of keeping the area free from evil. It's a dangerous and frightening job, as 29 boys before him have trained to take the Spook's place. Will Tom succeed where every other apprentice has failed? Young Tom's encounters with witches, boggarts, ghosts and rippers are enough to keep you reading way past your bedtime. His friendship with a young witch, against his mentor's advice, comes with a steep price. What does Alice want in return for rescuing Tom again and again? Just how evil is Bony Lizzie? How can the Bane be stopped? What caused Morgan, Tom's predecessor, to go wrong? Are you hooked yet?

My favorite hook is the warning inscribed on the back of each book: Not to be read after dark, followed by a page number. How can anyone resist a peek?

The White Darkness by Geraldine McCaughrean

McCaughrean relates a harrowing tale of obsession set to the backdrop of nature's relentless fury.

Fourteen-year-old Sym has always been fascinated with Antarctica, especially with legendary explorer Captain Lawrence Titus Oates. When her eccentric Uncle Victor promises to take her on an expedition to The Ice, she can hardly believe her luck. But what starts out as a tourist trip, turns into a dangerous scientific expedition.

At first Sym is excited to help her uncle, and a father and son film team, on their quest to find Symme's Hole, the gateway to what Uncle Victor believes is an alien world inside the Earth's crust. However, after a series of strange illnesses and a violent explosion that leaves the group stranded, Sym starts to wonder if the quest has gone too far. Uncle Victor steals a snow vehicle and takes Sym MYSTERY MCC ON THE SHELF

and the filmmakers on a trek deep into the center of the White. Soon, supplies run low, and one of the filmmakers wants to turn back. Rather than stop the expedition, Uncle Victor leaves the man stranded in the snow, a sure death sentence.

This murder only confirms Sym's growing realization that Uncle Victor is not the sweet, quirky figure she knew growing up. He is a man obsessed with an impossible dream, and he won't let anything, or anyone get in his way.

Readers will clamor to go along with Sym as she journeys into the white darkness of Antarctica and of her past. It's easy to see why this book won the 2008 Michael L. Printz Award for Excellence in Young Adult Literature.



Kennedy listed *From Russia With Love* as one of his favorite novels, and by the time the third film, *Goldfinger*, was released in 1964, just about everyone knew who James Bond was, and the males wanted to be him.

If you've never read the Bond books, this is a good time to start. MLS has them. Oh, and here's an example of Fleming's sense of humor. The greatest of Bond's nemeses is Ernst Stavro Blofeld, head of the terrorist organization SPECTRE (SPecial Executive for Counter-intelligence, Terrorism, Revenge and Extortion). When we read Blofeld's biography in *Thunderball* we learn that he was born on May 28, 1908.





What do actors Noel Coward, David Niven, and Christopher Lee have in common with James Bond's creator, Ian Fleming? Fleming suggested all of them for roles in the movie version of *Dr. No*, the first Bond film—Niven to be Bond, Coward to be the title character, and Lee (who was Fleming's cousin) could play either role. None of them got the part, although Lee did co-star later in *The Man With the Golden Gun*.

Why a tip of the hat to Bond and Fleming now? May 28 marked the 100th anniversary of Fleming's birth in 1908. Bond first saw print in *Casino Royale* in 1953, so this is his 55th anniversary. The books were well-reviewed in Britain but didn't make a splash in the U.S. until President

ne of the Metropolitan Library System's fastest growing programs is the Summer at the Library series for teens, and 2008 should set a record for participation.

"We haven't had a summer program for teens in place nearly as long as the one for children," said MLS Young Adult Services Coordinator Emily Williams, "but we have one now and it's growing faster than unmowed grass."



Explore Some Databases

hen was the last time you went exploring? And I don't mean checking out garage sales, although that's certainly not for the faint of heart.

s. Mkt Digest, Mutual Fi

No, I mean searching for something new, looking for specific information or just for stuff to broaden your horizons. You don't have to use a travel agent to put you in touch with the unusual or unknown. All you need is a computer with an Internet connection and the MLS website address – www.metrolibrary.org – and you're good to go.

At our webpage, follow this route. See the heading "Catalog & Databases" at the top? Click on it, and then put in your library card number. Now click on "Databases" and, Bingo!, you'll be faced with over 50 sources of information, some of which you once had to use reference books in the library to obtain and some are the magazines you buy every week/month.

So, what do you need to know? **Infoweb NewsBank** contains over 400,000 articles published in more than 500 newspapers from 1991 to the present. Also archived are more than 28,000 articles appearing in more than 295 newspapers between 1970 and 1991. Access to *USA Today* and to fulltext coverage of *The Daily Oklahoman* is also provided.

FACTS.com gives you everything

from landmark court decisions to trivia by uniting seven core reference databases that answer questions about events, issues, statistics and people of the last 20 years.

We've also got the **Dun and Bradstreet Million Dollar Database**. Here you will find summary information on 1.2 million companies with sales over \$20 million or 20 or more employees. Million Dollar Database is updated every 45 days.

Want to find out just who your ancestors really were? Ancestry.com accesses over one billion names and over 2,500 databases, including:

* Census Indexes containing the United States census, state censuses, and various federal schedules for the United States and Canada.

* Persi, The Periodical Source Index, contains the largest and most widely used index of genealogical and historical articles in the world.

* AGBI, The American Genealogical-Biographical Index, accesses millions of names appearing in printed genealogical records and family histories.

* UMI Obituaries contain the full text of hundreds of thousands of obituaries from 85 newspapers since 1990. This database also includes marriage records for 25 states, the Social Security Death Index and the Civil War Muster Rolls.

NOTE: To access ancestry.com, you must be logged in while at one of our libraries.

You get the picture. Don't you? If not, check out AccuNet/AP Multimedia Archive, which contains about 500,000 recent and archived photographs from the library of the Associated Press. It features images of historical figures and significant events of the 19th and 20th centuries.


We also subscribe to databases that will help answer your medical questions, auto and truck repair, government documents, science fair projects for kids, how to write a research paper, and so much more. Want to find out how Consumer Reports ranked washers and dryers? Go to the Magazines and More tab, and use the "Master File Premier database". In this database, you can not only find Consumer Reports, but you can also brush up on your sailing skills by reading Sailing World or find out how to get that beach body by browsing Shape magazine. Want to know who Paris Hilton's current flame is? We've got People Magazine in this database, too.

Now that you know how to find them, explore our databases at will. If you can't find anything to pique your interest, you know too much already.
