





s any successful fast food restauranteur or movie producer will tell you, the best way to develop a loyal customer base is to market your products to children. Like most "helping" professionals, librarians don't do what we do in hopes of striking it rich. No, our hopes lie in helping others, especially children, strike it rich – whether they be real riches or metaphorical ones. At the Metropolitan Library System, our professional ancestor, Miss Ann Hough, knew this quite well when she inaugurated a summer reading program for children with the stated goal of "catching them young and holding them by the silken cords of interest, enthusiasm and love for reading which will survive and persist throughout adult life."

This month the library system kicks off Summer Reading, the silver tuna of our children's programs. This year's theme is "Be Creative," but topping the creativity of Miss Hough may be tough. Nearly eighty years ago, her desk at the Carnegie Library was transformed into a railway ticket agent's booth for Vacation Travel Club. Children received a passport and tickets to ride the Bookland Special to destinations around the world. Children could choose to go abroad or "See America First." As the child read a book about each location the ticket was punched to commemorate the voyage. The program was wildly popular and Miss Hough reported that the number of books that were checked out tripled that summer.

Here you can see an interesting artifact which has survived from the Vacation Travel Club's 1931 excursion. This passport belonged to little Elizabeth Anne Jacobs, age 7½. It's always a treat to be able to see an item like this which has survived the boom and bust cycles of interest in our past, but this one is special to me because it not only has a past, it also

has a future. The interesting thing about this passport is that Ms. Jacobs, a jeweler's daughter, later became a top student at Classen High School and Oklahoma City University before joining the Foreign Service. She served in South America for a number of years and later lived in Italy as well. Upon returning home she became a pioneer of language instruction on television and in the public schools. Did her successful career and lifelong love of things international begin that summer of 1931 at the library? I like to think so.

Librarians rarely know when they have made a difference in a person's life. We know it happens because we hear today from people like Elizabeth Anne who were affected by Miss Hough and her contemporaries. And we only hope that future librarians who in fly in cars and transmit information by telepathy will hear how we "dinosaurs" influenced today's kids who will grow up to transform the world.

Bolt is a Disney animated movie about a dog who stars in a TV series featuring a superpup and the young girl who owns him and shares his adventures. The thing is, he doesn't realize that nothing about his life is true and that he is surrounded by actors. There's a slight resemblance to Disney's cash cow Hannah Montana, and the similarities are driven home with the voice casting of Miley Cyrus to play Penny, Bolt's girl. John Travolta provides the voice of the dog, comedian Susie Essman is a street-wise alley cat, and Malcolm McDowell is Dr. Calico, the TV show's villain.

The animation is up to a higher standard than

the usual Disney product of late, although it's still light years behind Pixar's. The script is amusing and, remarkably enough, Travolta can still produce a youthful, excitable dog voice. Kids will love the animal characters and adults can watch for quirky inside jokes. At one point, a bus zooms along beneath Bolt on an overpass, and it is clearly the bus from the movie *Speed*.

This is one the whole family can enjoy.

The Urban Hermit: A Memoir by Sam MacDonald

"The food – enough for an entire week – cost me a grand total of eight dollars...Eight dollars. A lunch at Applebee's for everyone else in the world.

But not for me."

Lentils, tuna fish (not Starkist but the cheap, shredded kind), eggs, white bread, green cabbage, sliced cheese. And there you have it, the weekly dietary intake of Sam MacDonald, self-proclaimed Urban Hermit.

Broke, overweight, deeply in dept, MacDonald is shocked into taming a life of over-consumption by a notice from the IRS. Losing the weight was secondary in his desire to pay his bills. What little bit of research he did consisted of contacting a nutritionist cousin who was horrified by his plans. Living on 800 calories a day could possibly send him into kidney failure, she told him. He needed at least 1,200 calories a day.

"Sure, she was a professional nutritionist. But


twelve hundred calories? I was tough," he writes.

MacDonald warns that his memoir is not a diet book. Anyone trying to mimic his experience will more than likely get hurt. Instead, his struggle seems to represent an age of American excess being slapped firmly in the face by the realities of bingeing.

The bizarre journey lasted more than a year. During that time, MacDonald lost over 160 pounds, quit smoking, severely limited his alcohol content and recreational drug use, traveled to Bosnia, communed with hippies, and met the woman who would become his wife. Oh yeah, and that debt he owed to the IRS? He paid it off as well.

Not bad for 800 calories a day.

The Tiaga Indians' days may be numbered since there are only 30 members left. Most of the tribe has become Americanized through marriage or survival in the 21st century. A small number of Tiagas still live the old ways with only tradition to guide them. With civilization encroaching, deforestation and pollution, the remaining Tiaga hold on to what they know. Their hope is their young.

In Linda Hogan's narrative, *Power*, sixteen-year old Omishto leads readers through the Florida backwoods, bare survival in the eye a hurricane, as well as through painful indecision and the sting of elderly resolve. With a foot in two worlds, Omishto or "She Who Watches" faces the unknown to find her power.

But what is power? There are several definitions: the ability to act or produce and effect; possession of control, authority or influence over others; a source or means of supplying energy. In Linda



Hogan's *Power*, all three definitions aptly describe the struggles her characters face in this fictional story of a disappearing native tribe in the Florida wilderness.

"Mystery is a form of power," Hogan writes. She should know. Her *Mean Spirit* was chosen for the Oklahoma Book Award, the Mountains and Plains Booksellers Award, and was a finalist for a Pulitzer Prize. *Book of Medicine* received the Colorado Book Award as well as being a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award. Hogan exudes a powerful spell over readers. Her talent for stirring the plot with rich imagery and vivid characterizations into high energy drama creates a must read frenzy. Now, that's power.


At the reading of their grandmother Grace's will, orphans Amy and Dan learn an astonishing truth about their family, the Cahills. According to Grace's executor, nearly every important figure in history, from Lewis and Clark to Abraham Lincoln to Harry Houdini, has been a member of the Cahill family. In her will, Grace invites forty family members to make a difficult choice: receive one clue and embark on a quest around the world to discover the source of the Cahill's power, or take \$1 million dollars and go home. Faced with the prospect of having their earnings stolen by their cruel Aunt Beatrice, Amy and Dan (and six other teams) decide to take the challenge.



With the help of their au pair, Nellie, the two start out on a quest that leads them across continents and into multiple scrapes with death. The result is a fast-paced mystery/adventure sure to titillate middle grade imaginations.

This book, the first in a series of ten by different writers, has been accused of being little more than a marketing ploy, but I think the quality of Riordan's writing saves it from the gimmick graveyard, and I will definitely check out book two when it gets here.



Archer has diverged from his usual style to write a fictionalized account of the life of George Mallory who, along with several other British climbers, attempted to be the first to reach the summit of Everest in 1924. The first person who beat the odds and climbed to the top would be revered internationally with the same esteem as Neil Armstrong walking on the moon in the 1960s, as neither feat had been achieved before. Mallory and his companion climber Andrew "Sandy" Irvine were both last sighted 900 feet from the summit. The question that is still unanswered today is whether they actually made it to the top ahead of the first man to officially do so in 1953, Sir Edmund Hillary. Mallory's frozen body was found 75 years later in 1999, 27,000 feet from the summit and his body gave no conclusive clues as to whether they reached the summit or

Archer has written an absorbing light hearted account of Mallory's life including a fictionalized description of him scaling the Eiffel Tower. He describes Mallory's conflicting love for two women, his wife Ruth and Chomolunga, Goddess mother of the Earth or Mount Everest. Anyone who reads this book will certainly want to find out more about this extraordinary mountaineer who lost his life for the sake of exploration and for the glory of his country.

This book is also available in a large print edition.

An Irish Country Doctor by Patrick Taylor

Move over James Herriot; you now have competition. Patrick Taylor has written a fictional version of his own experiences working as a physician in rural Ireland. In this case, however, the patients are humans instead of farm

Young Barry Laverty, fresh out of medical school, answers an ad for a position as physician's assistant in the village of Ballybucklebo in Northern Ireland. His prospective employer is Dr. Fingal O'Reilly, a character every bit as bold and brash as Herriot's employer, Siegfried Farnon. O'Reilly sets out to train Laverty in the important aspects of medicine—such as not allowing the patient to get the upper hand.

After the doctors see patients in the mornings, they tear off down the lanes to make home visits. O'Reilly runs bicyclers off the road and

takes corners on two wheels. Along the way, Barry gets to know the eccentric residents and learns that he will have to earn their trust. O'Reilly discretely manipulates circumstances so that Barry appears in the best possible light. Nevertheless, the young doctor has to learn to face the consequences of his mistakes.

Barry goes from fearing he won't be asked to stay on with O'Reilly, to trying to decide if he really wants to stay. The story is continued in the sequels, An Irish Country Village and An Irish Country Christmas. I hope the doctors don't run out of patients any time soon.

ummer vacation didn't begin officially until the next morning, when we slept through our normal school day wake-up time, but we could already smell the honeysuckle sweetness of June and July in the air.

Your Metropolitan Library System has been adding to that fragrance every summer for a long time with its annual Summer @ the Library events for children. There is no more happily established warm weather tradition than this one, and the theme for Summer 2009 is "Be Creative."

From I-35 on the way from Oklahoma City to Guthrie, turn east on old Route 66. Pass Lake Arcadia, Pops, and the round barn. When you get to Luther, turn right on N. Ash Street. Follow the library signs to 310 NE 3rd and you'll find the Luther Library.

By 1966, The Metropolitan Library System had six bookmobiles on the road, serving the otherwise unserved portions of the county. Their peak year of service was 1968, when they made a combined total of 44 stops per month, but by 1976 the stops had been reduced to 10, and a year later the cost of gasoline dropped that total to five, and they were semi-permanent. One of them was at Luther.

Gradually, the stationary bookmobiles were retired. Some of the stops vanished, and in some locations permanent buildings were constructed or purchased. Finally, the only bookmobile was in Luther. Extension Specialist Angie Paeltz can tell you stories of what it was like after school when that small trailer filled up with kids looking for something to read or trying to do some research on the public access computers.

The new Luther Library opened in a renovated pre-existing building on May 8, 2004, and the era of MLS bookmobile service came officially to a close.

our Metropolitan Library System developed a unique series of events for teens seven years ago and the program has been growing in popularity since the beginning.

"To get the sign up prizes," said MLS Young Adult Services Coordinator Emily Williams, "teens just need to come to whatever library is closest to them and register for the program. For every goal they reach, they get entered into the drawings for some great prizes, and the more goals they finish, the more chances they have to win a Flip Video Camera, Laser Quest passes, VISA shopping cards, Frontier City / Whitewater Bay tickets, and Sonic gift cards."

The reading program set up as it was last year--with new and more exciting prizes. As far as events go, well, teens won't find anything more fabulous than our Kick-Off event.

"We're holding another Wizard Rock concert this year, and it's going to be on Tuesday, June 9th at 6:00 at the Midwest City Library," Emily said. "We've scheduled an amazing line-up of bands, including the Whomping Willows, Justin Finch-

Fletchley, the Remus Lupins, and the Moaning Myrtles. I know it sounds all Harry Pottery, but it's great music even if you don't attend Hogwarts."

Teens who have completed grades 6-12 are eligible to enroll in the program, complete the goals and take home prizes. "I can't wait to see people's reactions to our other exciting teen programs: video games, henna art, graffiti art, hip hop dance, Chinese brush painting, face painting. It looks like too much fun," Emily added.

"All of this is free, of course, and the classes are presented by professionals."

Bell, Ted. *Nick of Time*.

J SCIENCE/FICTION/BEL/COMPACT/DISC

Here's an audiobook that would make the perfect traveling companion for a summer road trip with teens. The author of the Alex Hawke spy novels for adults tries his hand at a time travel story for young adults. Everything that appeals to kids, especially boys, is packed into this one—pirates from the golden age of sail, WW II adventure, even a time machine built by Leonardo da Vinci.

Furst, Alan. *The Spies of Warsaw*. FICTION/FUR/COMPACT/DISC

Here's an audiobook version of the latest thriller by Alan Furst, the undisputed contemporary master of the historical espionage story. This one is set in Poland in 1937. Col. Jean-François Mercier handles a spy network out of the French Embassy in Warsaw, and when he discovers that one of his best agents is under Gestapo suspicion, the tension and excitement really heat up.
