Marion Rock thought of books. We have to think outside the books.


The Internet & Databases:

For over a dozen years now our primary non-book ally in helping people reach their lifelong learning goals is the Internet, but it's not enough for us to use the net to answer questions, and that's why offering free online access at every MLS library is so important. We subscribe to nearly 90 databases, all of which can be accessed on the internet to customers for free. To provide universal access to our customers, MLS has hundreds of public computers and more than 52,000 customers used them last year. Of these users, over 706,000 computer sessions were logged.

Unique Customers Served by Library




Electronic Media:

Events & Activities



And if one night you just want to sit quietly at home alone, you can always check out a book!




Program Attendance During FY09-10


