Progress

In keeping with our tradition of offering cutting edge services, we launched new technology to make using library services and staying informed easier, portable and always available.

- Enabled easy access to more comprehensive information to our members through the new online catalog and website
- Optimized digital services with streaming audiobooks, eReading rooms and iPad checkouts
- Increased participation in the Summer Reading program by providing convenient access to a new online format

Partnerships

Community partnerships were crucial for libraries. Partners helped us reach more people with a common goal.

- Widened our reach with our *Come Read with Me* program – a literacy program that brings together community volunteers and young readers for 30-minute reading sessions at local schools, agencies and clubs, and community centers
- Expanded access to books and materials through development centers, senior centers, community and recreation centers in Oklahoma County
- Increased library usage for students at the Ronald J. Norick Downtown Library by housing the Odyssey Leadership Academy and serving as the school library for Positive Tomorrows, John Rex Elementary School and the YMCA child care program

Purpose

To grow smarter communities one person at a time, we offered access to cultural events and educational programs like Homework Help, Reading Buddies, Rocket Readers, Children Reading to Dogs and more.

- Strengthened reading skills and school success to thousands of Oklahoma County students
- Provided crucial literacy, GED, language and job skills classes to nearly 2,000 adults
- Created a world class cultural event for over 1,000 visitors of the Ralph Ellison Library with the Smithsonian Institution's traveling exhibit, Hometown Teams: How Sports Shape America




