# Online StorySLAM Program Makes Waves

**OKC StorySLAM** is a live monthly storytelling event. Participants are asked to tell personal stories off a chosen theme. All stories must be true, told without notes and must be told in 7 minutes or less. Our library system has partnered with OKC StorySLAM to offer the event virtually through the library's Facebook page. The last StorySLAM event had over 40 live attendees and over 1500 views.

To maintain the "live" feel and to keep bringing in new voices, OKC StorySLAM sets up a form for submissions each month and then vets the storytellers during a dress rehearsal the week before the event. May's theme was *All-Stars* and June's theme was *Stories of Pride*. Upcoming topics include Vacations, Black Voices, School, Fish Out of Water and Stories from Veterans.

"I love the OKC StorySLAM because it's a really powerful outlet for authentic voices," Teen Services Manager Emily Williams said. "With guidance from Special Collections, we've archived the last two events on Facebook to be sure to save these community stories."

Marketing, together with help from Engagement and Program Services, Collection Development and the Friends of the Library, put together a video documenting the creation of a giant "M" Metro Library logo.






# **Black Lives Matter Community Read**




