

More About Genealogical Records

Vital Records

These are records issued for the birth, marriage, divorce or death of an individual. These records can help find information such as birth dates/ locations, parents' names, maiden names of female ancestors, death dates and locations, and many other facts. Many states did not begin keeping these records until the late 19th or early 20th century.

Church Records

This is a great place to go when the records you are looking for are unavailable from the state, since church records often pre-date vital records. Many churches will keep birth, marriage and death records.

Courthouse Records

These records may include wills, deeds, tax lists and marriages. To utilize these records, the researcher will need to know the state and county in which their ancestor lived.

Census Records

The U.S. census contains the official count of the U.S. population. This is conducted every 10 years and sealed for 72 years before it is released. The most recent census available is the 1940 census, published in 2012.

eResources

Our library system has a robust collection of eResources available from home including Oklahoma specific resources; vital records from extensive collections such as Fold3, HeritageQuest Online, America's GenealogyBank and others; collections of maps including information such as original landowners; history databases and a variety of newspaper archives. Ancestry. com is also available, but for in library use only.

Research Guides
