

## Literary Voices 2019 with Kristin Hannah

New York Times bestselling author of *The Nightingale*, Kristin Hannah, is the featured speaker for the 17th annual Literary Voices<sup>®</sup> dinner. The event will be held on Wednesday, September 25, 2019 at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club at 7pm.



Kristin Hannah is the author of more than 20 novels, including her most recent release *The Great Alone*, which will be released in paperback in September. *The Great Alone* illustrates an emotional family saga in Alaska post-Vietnam War. The novel was called "a tour de force" by *Kirkus Reviews*. The book has also been optioned for film production.

Hannah is best known for *The Nightingale*, which depicts the lives of two sisters in France who are separated during World War II. It evokes the question, "what would you do to survive?" and leaves the reader asking themselves who they would be in an unthinkable life or death situation. The novel is in pre-production for film.

Hannah's novel *Home Front* has also been optioned for film by 1492 Films, producers of the Oscar-nominated film The Help, and Chris Columbus is set to direct the film. Hannah's book *Firefly Lane* is being developed into a series for Netflix staring Katherine Heigl.

The Literary Voices<sup>®</sup> dinner benefits the Library Endowment Trust, whose funds support library services and programs. This year's event will also include the presentation of the Lee B. Brawner Lifetime Achievement Award. This Award will be given to Cliff Hudson for his work within the Sonic Corporation to promote literacy and education locally, regionally and beyond.

Grow with Google programs are in full swing at our libraries. Programs include computer basics, skills workshops, resume boosters, coding clubs and more.

Our library customers can take charge of their learning by utilizing the free resources at their local library such as our Grow With Google programs, Capitol Hill Adult Engagement Specialist II Adam Farrari said.

"It makes me so happy when a student tells me they've found a cool new band or restaurant online, or that they've solved a problem with a creative Google search, or when they show me a nicely-formatted letter they've written outside of class," Farrari said.

Some things students have said they enjoy about the class include the ability to check out the Chromebooks, extensive personalized help, visual learning aids, handouts and one-on-one help. Here's what some of our librarians are saying about their experience with the Grow With Google programs:
