Teen tech month

Occupations in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) make up over six percent of all occupations in the United States.



Workers in STEM fields earn higher wages, and degree holders in STEM fields earn 12 percent more than non-STEM degree holders, according to a March 2017 report from the U.S. Department of Commerce.

The number of students pursuing degrees in STEM fields has declined but STEM jobs are growing twice as fast as jobs in other fields, according to a Young Adult Library Services Association report.

Oklahoma has seen a 24 percent uptake in STEM employment since 2016, compared to the national STEM employment growth rate of 10 percent, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.



Teen Tech Week is a national initiative of the Young Adult Library Services Association (YALSA) aimed at teens, their parents, educators and other concerned adults. The purpose of the initiative is

to ensure that teens are competent and ethical users of technology, especially the types offered through libraries.

So, what should you know about this oftentimes behindthe-scenes department? If you learn nothing else about them, know that they are constantly putting out proverbial fires, and your needs are important to them.

they also respond to regular PMs. PM is Preventative Maintenance carried out on a monthly basis - this is how they try to stay ahead of the game and repair things before you have to call them. Maintenance technicians are typically assigned to the preventative maintenance for a of couple of libraries and they are also the individuals that are likely going to respond to any unexpected breakdowns at that library.

Maintenance items that are not preventative are considered trouble calls - these are unexpected breakdowns that occur. These may be as minor as a light-bulb that needs to be replaced.

3. We want to fix it. We really do.

At any given time, the Maintenance Department has over 100 requests in the online request queue.

Many of these items are their monthly PMs or items that they have responded to but they are waiting on a part to fix the issue.

Tasks are prioritized based on the severity of the issue. While one library may need a new light bulb, another library may have a sewage backup the same day. The more serious issue will get attended to first.

4. We are doing everything we can to prevent bed bugs.

We want our libraries to be pest free and we are doing everything we can to make sure that they stay that way. We are in the process of building a larger heating space to place the ergo trolleys in and heat treat them. We have also made vacuuming a part of our monthly PM routine.

5. Planning and maintenance work together.

You may be aware that Steve Butts recently moved to Planning. This is to help better manage the variety of construction projects happening across the system. Steve is now in charge of new construction funded by local city government entities within Oklahoma County. Jim Phillips manages all system-funded projects requiring contract labor.

6. Our delivery drivers are like postmen; they deliver rain or shine.

During the winter our drivers brave the cold, in the summer they brave the heat and they are even out there during storm season. If

the library is open, our drivers are making deliveries.

7. Our drivers do more than simply transport books.

Our drivers also sort all of the books in the ergo trolleys using the sorter. Often times there are so many books to be sorted that they will sort books by hand while one of them puts books on the automatic sorter.

8. It is helpful if you can tell the drivers what you are anticipating for the following day.

When the drivers arrive at your library they are assessing what you have and trying to anticipate what you will need for the next day. Sometimes they are unable to bring things like donation bins because they are out - they transport many items each day and if they can plan ahead they may be able to better meet your needs.
