Automation: Singlehandedly Solving the System's Stacks of Stray Sheets Smoothly



When the Metropolitan Library System began offering Internet usage for the public in 1996, we first filed the Internet Agreement forms in a banker's box.

When that box was outgrown, we then filed the forms on the shelves behind the Circulation Control desk, later adding a large filing cabinet.

Now that we have more than 63,000 Internet Agreements on file, with more being added daily, we once more have a need for additional space. The solution was to scan the forms and save them to a CD.

The libraries have all played a part in ensuring that the scanning has gone well. They have taken extra care to see that the printing on the forms is dark and legible and that the forms are in good condition for scanning (many, many thanks!). The CD in the picture has approximately 7,300 Internet Agreements on it!

We have also begun scanning the library card applications. This will allow us to have a permanent record of all Internet Agreements and Library Card Applications.

Staff Association Views and Reviews

The SA Executive Council was also a victim of the Oklahoma Ice Storm in January. We were postponed a week, because the libraries were closed on the scheduled day of our meeting. So the new year started off a little slow, but your representatives did meet at Belle Isle on Feb 7.

Plans were initiated for our involvement in the MS Walk to be held in April. Our SA Council will sponsor a rest stop for the walkers. We'll be looking for helpers so keep it in mind.

One of the responsibilities of your SA Executive Council is to have a representative attend commission meetings, pension board meetings, long range planning meetings and other types of meetings where decisions are made that affect the whole system and its employees. This is happening, and reports are made to the whole executive council. Then your reps can bring information back to the staff on each site. It is hoped this adds to the staff understanding of things that affect their work environment. Feel free to ask your reps questions. We'll share what we know and then search for answers where needed.

Conversations are continuing with the administration about the concerns you have expressed. Here are some thoughts about some of those concerns.

1. Health care is a national concern as well as one we have here. Our system has some good health care coverage and is searching for ways of keeping it. Keeping it at a reasonable cost is always a vital concern.

2. Our pages are an important part of our staff, and we are looking at ways to help them be fairly compensated.

3. Our pension plan affects all of us. Decisions made there will ultimately touch each of us. We are fortunate in our system to have a defined benefit retirement plan. The library system, rather than the individual employee, bears the risk involved in fluctuating investment returns. Anne Hsieh, MLS director of finance, is always available to answer questions. She states our plan was funded at 127% on July 1, 2002. This means that our plan had more than enough to cover any benefits due at that time. We will follow the developments there.

4. Ways of continuing a Staff Development Day that provides helpful employee training is discussed.

This list is not all inclusive but hopefully lets you know that your Staff Association is involved on your behalf.

Our SA Executive Council meetings are scheduled for 3:00 p.m. on the Thursday following each Commission meeting and are at the same locations as the Commission Meetings. At this time Norm Maas, MLS Director, will meet with the council for roundtable discussions on March 28 and September 5. All staff are welcome at any of our meetings.

Plans for our annual Staff Association Meeting have begun. Committees were formed, and soon you'll be hearing more about this event.
