Views and Reviews: News from Your Staff Association

Here's a spotlight on the talent and generosity of another MLS staff member. Derek Cash, librarian at Warr Acres, has just returned from a two-week trip to Mexico June 21 to July 5. Although he did learn to play the spoons at our Staff Association Annual meeting, he did not go on tour with his musical talent.

What he did was donate vacation time -plus his skills and expertise as a librarian- to help the Mexican Baptist Theological Seminary in Mexico City put its library catalog online. The seminary is a small school of about 100 students.

This project actually began back in January when Derek was surfing the Web and found opportunities for service listed on the Southern Baptist website. He began communicating via e-mail with the group and was introduced to Mary Waechter who is librarian of the Marian Sanders Library at the seminary. She welcomed his help in getting their catalog updated and online.

Derek and Mary evaluated several

software programs to determine the best one for the library's purposes. One major requirement was that it be usable in both English and Spanish. People with each language would be implementing it and using it. They chose the Softlink program and were thrilled when the company donated the software with the only requirement being yearly maintenance contract. This alone saved the school about \$15,000.

Through many e-mails over several months time, Derek directed the preparations for implementing the computer program. One big part of those preparations was weeding the collection since it was very old, and the card catalog was out of date. Teachers as well as the librarian worked on this phase.

When Derek arrived in Mexico City, he enjoyed the hospitality of Mary and Steve Waechter in their home. Although he did have a few "spicey hot" meals, Mary also prepared some good American dishes, too. Derek reports that eating bread right after the "hot" food helps.

His days from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and they were spent teaching the librarian and a tech how to use the software, how to catalog and how to look for the necessary information to catalog some of the old but valuable books. Attention was also given to security issues. Most of the work was completed, and the students and faculty will now have quick access to their resources. At the end of the two

weeks, Derek received many gracias and much appreciation for his service. They really wanted him to stay two years rather than two weeks.

Derek did manage to include a little sightseeing while there. He visited the pyramids, the Palace of Fine Arts, the Basilica of Guadeloupe and the Museum of Anthropology.

When asked what he learned from his experience, Derek listed these things: he found he does not like to eat *jicama*; he does like to eat mangoes and fresh
