Friends of the Library Awards 2003 Grant Monies

The Friends of the Library recently awarded grants for library use. Money from the grants comes primarily from The Friends annual Booksale held in February.

In the **Children's** category, LIFÉ Come Read With Me, Outreach, received **\$5,000**.

40th Anniversary Celebration Children's program at BI received **\$1,000.**

In the **Teens/Young Adults** category, the MLS teen Summer Reading, the library program at Outreach, was awarded **\$1,7000**. The Teen Space Signage at Midwest City received **\$350**.

In the **Adults** category, A Kaleidoscope of Cultures at the Village, received **\$6,000**.

In the **Seniors** category, **\$3,500** was given to Outreach for Book Center book cases.

In the **All Ages** category, Outreach received **\$14,800** for the Our World Series of programs.

Belle Isle received an unknown amount for its 40th Anniversary Celebration concert. And Bethany Library received **\$1,500** for the Shannon Lucid Education Project.

In the **Recognition** category, MLS Volunteer Recognition received **\$3,000** and the Staff Recognition reception received **\$4,550**.

For Librarian Recruitment, \$10,000 was given for the Lee B. Brawner Scholarship Fund.

Under **Miscellaneous**, Maintenance received **\$17,500** for a new 1½ ton truck.

To wrap a City bus,MLS received **\$5,000** towards the Dalmatian Bus Wrap.

Midwest City received **\$1,500** for gallery wall lighting.

And The Village Library received **\$5,000** for a sign.


This note from Cheryl Cherry, circulation clerk:

At future meetings we plan to invite administrators to attend briefly, so that they can explain policies/practices for their departments. We believe that it will help us better understand the library system.




