We've been talking for years about the need for a library in the far NW part of the city. Every time someone expressed the desire to build one, a long, wistful sigh ended the thought.

Well now, the sighs have turned to smiles of pleasure because the new library is due to open in March 2012. Once approved by the Commission and the City of Okalhoma City, the library will be officially named the Patience Latting Northwest Library.

Customers and the media will be asking us all questions about the library and a lot of information can be gathered from our website, but here are a few of the informational nuggets in which people will be most interested:

- Cost will be approximately 8.2 million dollars
- Cost is coming from general obligation bonds passed in 2000 and 2007
- 35,000 square feet
- Collection size will be about 156,000 items
- The system's third largest library
- 60+ public computers
- Should become one of the first LEED certified libraries (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) in Oklahoma

Since November was National Novel Writing Month and **Beth Wilson** at MC invited writers to spend their lunch hours at the library working on a novel, we at **ShelfLife** thought we'd check with MLS staff to see if any of you took up the challenge last month to write an entire novel in 30 days. The novels were supposed to clock in at around 50,000 words—maybe you just started a novel to be completed later.

Six of you wrote in to tell us that you, or in one case a husband, were working on novels. **Marilyn Backus** (Mat Sel) asked "Can we have a Procrastinating Novelists' Month in December @ DN?" but we think every month is Procrastinating Novelists Month.

Here're what our colleagues are working on:

Christine Bassett (BI) wrote that she isn't writing anything right now, but her husband is.

"Unfortunately I am not composing right now but my husband Charlie Bassett has put his novel in a rough state on SMASHWORDS under Nathan Bassett (http://www.smashwords.com/books/search?query=nathan+bassett). It is a fictionalized account of the time he spent in Africa when at ORU in the '70s and may be of interest to some. The title is *The Smoke That Thunders* which is another name for the Victoria Falls."

Susan Beckett (WA) told us that she has been working on a book for awhile. It's called Cavers Go to War. "Adela Baker joins a spelunking course to help her get over fears of small, dark places, little knowing this will lead to her being drafted into the Army with her fellow cavers and a dog, searching in caves for a small item that could cause catastrophic events if used."

Sample sentence: Galen volunteered to stay with Devin and Adela, "If she passes out, I'll just throw her over my shoulder and tote her out o the cave," he

said with a grin while flexing his large muscles, which caused his dragon tattoo to appear as if it were alive and breathing.

Betsy Brown (MC) is writing a work of fan fiction that extends the world of Harry Potter. "Daffodil Dursley," she told us, "is the daughter of Dudley Dursley and a lateblooming witch. While at Hogwarts, she hears about a plot by some of the Slytherin students to misuse time turners to return to the past so that they can undo the fall of Lord Voldemort. Trying to thwart them, Daffodil follows them back in time to an alternate past".

"I'm a part-time public computer specialist," Betsy wrote, "and only work about 26 hours a week, so I really should have the time to finish this novel. I've done this five times before, after all, and it's the sort of thing that gets easier with practice."

It's hard to tell if **Chris Carroll** (DVS) is entirely serious. "I've got a semiautobiographical novel called *Low Overhead* that has been incubating in the dusty corners of my mind and my home computer's hard drive for a while, so if this meets your criteria perhaps a note in ShelfLife would be the very thing to spur it to completion . . . or at least spur me to begin work on Chapter 2, in which I plan to take up arms against the impending zombie apocalypse. . . ."

Katie Trattner (Tech Processing) admits to being "a bit behind but still in the game. I can't make it to MC to write on my lunch breaks but I get some done here. At the moment I'm working on a steampunk fantasy full of assassins, midnight chases, and epic battles between good and evil.


With a bit of romance thrown in for good measure. There's lots of blood too. My opening line for the book is: 'He stepped over the body of the wailing child's dying father.' The plot at the moment isn't very solid but what it boils to is a woman who is raised to be the best assassin in a city divided into black and white, but of course life is full of gray."

And the person who started this whole thing, **Beth Wilson** (MC), wrote: "I'm a little behind but I feel confident I can still finish in time and win. One year I started on Nov 2 and finished the entire 50,000 words by the 14th, so I know I can do it. The trick is turning off that silly voice in my head that says, 'That doesn't sound good' and similarly discouraging things that slow down my typing speed.

"My novel is about a woman who's a substance abuse counselor losing her job due to the state cutbacks. She has her son, who is twenty and going to college at OU, move back home in order to help stretch her savings, and one of his roommates moves in, too. The roommate has a relationship with a very volatile girl who goes missing after a party, and Chris asks his mom to help them find her.

"So there you have it! The basic plot of my novel. How does it end? I don't have a clue!"

Sometimes we expect too much of ourselves. We come to work in the morning with the idea that we're going to push ourselves to get projects 1-10 finished. Maybe we actually do it—but how well?



Author Babauta suggests that we start the day with a shorter list of things to work on, things we can do well. We may, at a slower, more thoughtful pace, find that we can accomplish more than we thought we could—and even better, that we do what we do so well, we don't have to re-visit the same project next week to correct all the mistakes we made in our haste.

Don't get the book wrong—Babauta isn't suggesting that we all slow down to the point of doing less than we should be able to. He just thinks that time management is essential to success.

Access Video has over 8,800 films from producers such as the A&E Network, ABC, BBC, CBC, CBS, CNBC, National Geographic, NBC, PBS, Bill Moyers, Jim Lehrer, Rick Steves (travel videos) and many more. Access Video videos can be viewed on PCs, Macs, iPads and other internet-enabled mobile devices. All of our content also includes unlimited and remote access without any platform for your library to purchase or any platform for your library patrons to install on their computers.

"After you click on individual title you will see a tab that says "Full Title." Here you will find a short description of the film, length of the video and the copy right date."

The new facility will have approximately 3000 sq. feet for library materials and services. A site dedication was held on Saturday, October 29 at 10:30 a.m. near the intersection of Hiwassee and Britton Road in Jones.

Jones is one of those central Oklahoma cities that aren't thought of too often by its larger neighbors, but it's near one of Washington Irving's 1835 campsites, and the city itself dates from 1898. With the construction of the new high school and the Jones Oklahoma Historical Society museum, the new Jones Library will

constitute a sort of small scale MAPS project for the town.


