New Catalog Cards

No, we're not returning to the old days of catalog cards (for you young guys, catalog cards were the cards that got slimed at the beginning of *Ghostbusters*.)

But Cataloging is transitioning to a new method of creating original catalog records. It's called "RDA"—Resource Description and Access.

"These are the new cataloging guidelines that replace AACR2, the Anglo-American Cataloging Rules, 2nd edition," said Cataloging Manager **Pauline Rodriguez-Atkins**. "All the catalogers have received training and are in the practice stage. We are excited about how well it is going!" The guidelines were implemented by Library of Congress on March 31; MLS implemented on the same date.

"They don't make much difference to library staff or customers," Pauline added, "except that some records might look a little different. It's a huge change for catalogers, though. Any original record that we create and contribute to WorldCat must conform to RDA. It has meant a lot of extra training and practice for our Catalogers."

Volunteer Coordinator **Heidi Port** sends her thanks and congratulations to MLS staff for their record-breaking support of the Food Drive. MLS is responsible for a donation of 1,148 pounds of food (and cash donations totaling \$95). The food donation is over 400 pounds more than was given in 2012.

"The Regional Food Bank's administrative costs are below four percent," Heidi said, "which means that 96 cents of every dollar donated help to directly provide food to Oklahomans in need. For every \$1 donated, the Regional Food Bank provides five meals, so just the monetary donations alone will provide 475 meals. "Remember, too, that if you'd like to help the two coworkers who lost their homes in the tornadoes you can send monetary donations (marked as a tornado donation) to the Business Office, attention **Jeffery Mullins**. All donations received will go directly to these individuals."

Heidi also sends a special thank you shout out to the "Staff Association Reps who helped facilitate the drive and Maintenance who picked up and delivered all our donations! We appreciate you!"

- 3. Bruce P. Crandall. Crandall was a flight commander in Vietnam. 11/14/65
- 4. James H. Doolittle. Brigadier General Doolittle was given the award for services rendered in World War II.
- 5. Douglas MacArthur. General, U.S. Army, for services on the Bataan Peninsula
- 6. Edward V. Rickenbacker. American air ace in WW I. For action near Billy, France, 9/25/18

- 7. Theodore Roosevelt. For acts of bravery on 7/1/1898, near Santiago de Cuba
- 8. Theodore Roosevelt, Jr. Brigadier General, for actions on 6/6/44
- 9. Alvin C. York. For bravery above and beyond on 10/8/18, near Chatel-Chehery, France
- 10. Mary Edwards Walker. Won the medal on 11/11/1865. It was rescinded in 1917, and restored on 6/10/1977 by President Carter. To date, she is the only female winner of the award.
