You just arrived for your shift. You sign in and then check to be sure you have all the supplies you need.

A mother is registering her son for Summer Reading. She keeps asking you questions like, "When is the last day of the program?" You roll your eyes. Everyone knows it ends July 31!

A 5-year-old comes up to the table with his mom to sign up. You make sure to explain the game to the child using small words that he can understand.

Someone asks you a difficult question that you're unsure about, so you direct them to the nearest librarian.

You're bored during your shift, so you get out your phone to text your best friend about your plans for later.

Your shift is over and you've left the sign-up table neat and tidy for the next person.

It's not too busy, so you get out a book to read, but you keep looking up to make sure you're aware of anyone approaching.

There's a sudden crowd at the table, but you take the time to make sure every child gets exactly what he or she needs.

Even library staff members notice that you're always smiling.

2 spaces

You're sitting at the table when you feel your cell phone vibrate. It can wait- you have a break coming up in 15 minutes.

2 spaces

You're in the middle of helping a large group of customers when you run out of registration cards. You hadn't even noticed you were getting low.

2 spaces

It's the 10th time today you've been asked about the ages for the different divisions of Summer Reading, but you take the question seriously and answer it

2 spaces

A child comes to get his Goal 1 prize. You give it to him but forget to mark it on the registration card.

2 spaces

You get so immersed in the book you're reading at the volunteer table that you put your feet up in the empty chair next to you and lean back to get comfortable.

You're not scheduled to volunteer right now but your friend, Tabitha, is. You decide you'll just hang out at the volunteer table while Tabitha works her shift.

3 spaces

You won't be able to make your shift for tomorrow and call the night before so the volunteer supervisor can find coverage for your shift.

3 spaces

You get bored at the volunteer desk and decide to reorganize the books in the reader section by color.

3 spaces

A mom comes in without her children to claim their summer reading goal prizes. You tell her you're sorry but her children must be present to claim their prizes.

3 spaces

Even library staff members notice that you're always smiling.

3 spaces

A 3rd grader finishes their goal 2 and comes in for their prize. You get really excited for them and give them a high five.

A group of your friends come to hang out at the library. You say a quick hi and tell them you'll meet up with them after your shift.

3 spaces

It has been a really slow day and you're dying for something else to do besides sit at the volunteer table. You ask one of the librarians if there's anything else you can help out with at the library.

3 spaces

No one will notice if you wear your flip flops while volunteering so you wear them even though you know they are against the dress code.

3 spaces

You run out of supplies in the middle of helping some customers. You yell over to the librarian on duty for help.

You don't understand how to fill out the registration cards so you ask one of the other volunteers to help you.

1 space

You are working the volunteer table alone and a big group of children need to claim their prizes. You remain calm and quickly but efficiently help each child in line.

You'd rather play video games instead of going volunteer today so you just don't show up for your shift. They won't miss you.

You don't really like a certain task you're supposed to do so you don't do it. Someone will do it on the next shift.

You're really close to beating your high score on one of the games you have on your phone. No one will notice if you hold it under the table and play it while you're working your shift.

You have been a volunteer before. You know what to do and don't need to be trained this year.

2 spaces

You love to draw and often draw funny little cartoons on the table for other volunteers to see.

2 spaces

You'd rather work at the times your friend is working so you show up when they are scheduled even though you are not. The more volunteers the merrier right?

2 spaces

You're working the last shift of the night so you make sure everything is ready to go for the next day to make it easier for the morning shift.

2 spaces

A mother gets really upset that her 6-year-old doesn't get the same goal 1 prize as her 2-year-old. You try to explain why but she is now angry so you bring over a librarian to help.

You love working with kids and ask your volunteer supervisor if you can occasionally help out with story time.

You notice you're running low on children's goal 1 prizes so you let a librarian know as soon as you can.

You notice a large stack of books on the floor in the Children's area and decide to re-shelve them to help out.

The game cards are set up to be printed on both sides of paper you just need to make sure the printer settings are set to color and print on both sides (with the flip over option). These will work best if printed on heavy card stock.

There are 50 situation cards (20 each for 1 and 2 space cards and 10, 3 space cards) and 10 challenge cards. Each volunteer gets a challenge card to lay down if they don't agree with the current player's decision.

All the fields are unlocked so you can change some of the situation cards to fit your location if needed.
