Characteristics of Adventure

- 1. **PACING** generally brisk; take place within a short time span and the time/date stamps at the head of the chapters often drive the pace.
- STORY LINE focuses on action, usually a mission, and the obstacles and dangers met along the way. Physical adventure and danger are paramount. Generally a happy ending with the hero safe and order restored.
- 3. **CHARACTERIZATION** always an identifiable hero (readers like and whom they can relate). Hero exhibits ingenuity and skill and accomplishes desperate mission.
- 4. **FRAME/SETTING** Details are important. Stores are set "elsewhere," and underlines a sense of danger and obstacles to be overcome. Maps often accompany these novels. Worlds of art, antiques, antiquities, and books also provide intriguing backgrounds.
- TONE/MOOD in response to life-threatening situations, many novels are dark, menacing and foreboding.
 In some humor lightens the tone.
- 6. **STYLE/LANGUAGE** colorful language and jargon fill these tales and conversational language invites the reader to participate in the hero's exploits.
